It's that time of year again.... election time! There are two seats open on the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board. The election opens in mid-February, but we are currently seeking candidate applications. The Master Association Board, along with their counterparts on the Metropolitan District Board, is a decisionmaking authority that shapes the future of the community. The Board is elected to establish policies and provide general direction to the Executive Director.

The expectations of a Board Member are attendance at the monthly Board Meeting, the monthly Joint Study Session and liaison meetings as assigned. Board members are also expected to communicate regularly and proficiently via email. Additional time or meetings may be necessary to fulfill the responsibilities as a Board Member. Parking Updates

Covenant Clips

Happy New Year Ken-Caryl!

As you all know by now, sometimes rules and regulations need to be reviewed and updated. The Architectural Committee and I have been working on updating the Parking Rules to be a little clearer and easier to understand. Proposed changes are in **BOLD**.

3.08 Parking Rules


The following parking rules shall be in effect on all land within the boundaries of Ken-Caryl Ranch. Homeowners and residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch shall be responsible for the parking and storage of vehicles owned or operated by their tenants, visitors and household guests. Any vehicle described in Section 4.05 of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions "... trailers, mobile homes, recreation vehicles, graders, trucks other than pickups, boats, tractors, campers, wagons, buses, sleighs, motorcycles, motor scooters, snowmobiles, snow removal equipment and garden and maintenance equipment..." shall not be permitted to be stored on any street or public right-of-way or on private property within Ken-Caryl Ranch, but shall be kept at all times in an enclosed garage, or stored at an off-site facility.

Approved Parkina and Vehicles

- A resident of Ken-Caryl Ranch may park a boat, camper, hobby/recreation trailer, or RV on the street or in the driveway for two non-consecutive 24-hour periods during a seven-day period.
- Passenger Vans (i.e. Sprinter, Cargo Vans, etc.) are allowed as a passenger vehicle so long as it doesn't have external utility hook ups and/or isn't a Class B Recreational Vehicle. A vehicle is defined as a Class B Recreational Vehicle if it has a place to sleep, a kitchen to prepare a meal and a bathroom.
- Construction trailers, dumpsters, and portable toilets required for a home improvement project are permitted for the duration of a project and must be promptly removed when no longer required.
- In accordance with state law, Emergency Vehicles that are required by the resident's employer (an Emergency Service provider such as Fire Department, law enforcement, or EMS) as a condition of employment, weighs ten thousand pounds or less, and has a visible emblem

or marking designating it as an emergency vehicle, may be parked in the driveway or on the street in front of the resident's property.

Prohibitions and Restrictions



- Any automobile, truck, or other vehicle, which displays lettering or advertising, carries equipment for a business, or is equipped for performing services, shall be kept at all times in an enclosed garage or at an offsite facility.
- Any automobile, truck, motorcycle, or other similar vehicle that does not have a valid registration sticker or temporary tag posted in plain view, or a vehicle which has one or more flat tires, broken windows, missing parts, or leaking **fluids** shall be parked in the garage until returned to an operable or complete condition.
- No parked vehicle **shall** obstruct emergency access or interfere with the use of the streets. Contact Jefferson County Sherriff for enforcement of street parking.
- No vehicle covers are permitted. **Enforcement**
- Parking violations on or in front of private property will be subject to the Violation **Notification Policy and Covenant** Enforcement, Section 1.05 of these rules.
- Vehicles blocking public rights of way, sightlines, or emergency access must be reported to the Jefferson County Sheriff for enforcement and are subject to ticketing and/or towing. Abandoned and stored vehicles on public property will be reported to the Jefferson County Sheriff and will be subject to ticketing and/or towing.

- The board reviewed a summary of proposed updates to the Master Association Reserve plan. The full plan will be presented to the Board at a future meeting.
- The following motions passed:

- o Approve the process for filling Dave Seagraves' board seat as a part of the 2022 MA board election.
- o Approve Patriot Pools & Spas in the amount of \$58,602 for replastering, retiling and coping for the Bradford Pool.
- o Add Master Association Board Member Chris Schroeder as a signer to all Master Association bank accounts.
- Public comment at the meeting addressed various topics, including wildfire mitigation, a proposed dedication to Dave Seagraves and the process for filling Dave Seagraves' board seat.

Dog Waste in Open Space

Editor's note: The Rangers receive more complaints about dog waste in open space during the winter months than any other time of year. Dog piles on top of the snow are very conspicuous and during the growing season vegetation tends to hide dog waste. Despite the fact that dog waste is more visible in the winter it is still a year-round problem. While most people have probably noticed this problem along our trails you may not be aware that the rangers find dog waste dumped in open space next to private property. This is especially aggravating because it is obvious that the adjacent homeowner does not want his dog's waste littering his yard but apparently thinks it's perfectly acceptable to litter open space with this waste! Hopefully the information in this article will help people understand the specific problems with dog waste and compel dog owners to be more diligent about picking up after their pets.

Dog waste is an unsightly mess!
Because dog food contains preservatives the ensuing waste does not biodegrade easily and those little piles stick around for weeks. Dog waste also poses a health problem for people and children walking around it. When you consider that an estimated 68 million Americans own a dog the overall impact is significant.

Many dog owners say they do not pick up after their dog, either because they feel the waste will eventually go away or it is too much of a hassle for them to pick up. Yet, it is to the benefit of human health that pet waste is disposed of correctly. Pet waste carries diseases that can cause humans to get sick. Just a single ounce of dog scat contains about 23 million microorganisms of bacteria, which is enough to cause sickness in humans. When infected dog droppings are left on the ground, the eggs of the roundworms and other parasites can linger in the soil for years. As a result, anyone who comes in contact with the soil also comes in contact with the infected eggs. Children run the greatest risk of infection because they're prone to play in the dirt at the park or playground and then put their hands in their mouths, or rub their eyes with their hands. But even a group of people playing Frisbee or touch football in an open area could be in danger. The germs carried by your pet can also cause diarrhea, stomach cramps, nausea, dehydration, fever, or a cough.

In an effort to address this problem, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board of Directors adopted Open Space Rule #5 in June 2002, which states "Owners or handlers must pick up after their household pets." If a ranger views a dog owner deciding not to pick up waste after their pet in the open space, the ranger will issue a contact notice to them. If the violation happens a second time, the user may be sent to a hearing with the Master Association Board of Directors.

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master
Association and Metropolitan District
have conveniently installed dog waste
bag dispensers and trash cans in various
locations for dog owners along the trails
to use and it is encouraging to note that
based on staff observation, these waste
stations are being used by many people.
We want to thank those dog owners
for helping to keep the open space,
greenbelts and parks free of pet waste.

One final note; some folks just don't finish the job. After "packaging" your dog's waste in a plastic bag please be sure to carry the package out of open space and dispose of properly. There is no



"poop fairy" that comes in and cleans up in the middle of the night or community resources assigned to patrolling the trails and colleting these packages like the curbside trash pick-up at your house. Please be a responsible dog owner and complete the job, start to finish.

It's that time again! Every three years Ken-Caryl Ranch updates the Open Space bracelets, and the new color is... drumroll please...YELLOW!

If you have an ORANGE open space ID bracelet it is no longer valid. To obtain a new yellow ID bracelet, which will be good until 2024, please visit the Ranch House or the Community Center during the following hours:

Ranch House (7676 S. Continental Divide Rd.)

Monday – Thursday, 9 a.m. – 4 p.m.

The Ranch House is closed to the public on Friday.

Community Center (1 Club Dr.)

Monday – Thursday, 6 a.m. – 7 p.m.

Friday, 6 a.m. - 5 p.m.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

We have simplified the registration process and it will take just a minute to grab your bracelets and be on your way. Now that we have fully reopened our facilities, all open space bracelet registration will be in-person. We appreciate you stopping by either of the convenient locations listed above.


If you are the homeowner, you will just need a photo ID. If you rent your home, are a brand-new resident and haven't updated your license, or are not the owner, you can provide any one of the following as address verification:

- 1. A valid Colorado Driver's License or Colorado I.D. with current KCR address.
- 2. A valid property tax statement with the applicant's name for the current KCR address.
- 3. A valid warranty deed with the applicant's name for the current KCR address.
- 4. A valid lease/rental agreement with the applicant's name for the current KCR address.
- 5. A recent utility bill (gas, water, electric, cable) with the applicant's name and current KCR address.

Most of our trails are on Ken-Caryl Ranch Private Open Space and are accessible only to members and their guests. Open space bracelets help rangers and volunteer patrollers quickly identify residents. It is not mandatory to have an ID bracelet when using Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space, but if you don't have an ID bracelet, please be prepared to stop and answer questions from a KCRMA Park Ranger or Volunteer Patroller.

There is no cost for open space bracelets. Bracelets are issued only two per household and can be temporarily transferred to house guests ONLY while they are staying in your home. Other guests must be accompanied by a Ken-Caryl resident.

Community Spirit Undaunted Again with 325 Hours Volunteered!

Another huge thank you to the dedicated Ken-Caryl Weed Warriors who took on the less than glamorous volunteer job of eradicating invasive mullein and various types of thistle in our open space. Thanks also to the knowledgeable Liam Cullinane, Ken-Caryl Ranger and Natural Resource Specialist, who trained and supported us all season.

From May 1 through Dec. 16, these true warriors have either dug up or bagged the cones and seed heads (filled with seeds) of 45,426 plants. This was from a backbreaking 325 hours volunteered! Many volunteers joined us this season, but special mention must be made to John Fosholt, Rebecca Fererra, Paul Wood, Rhonda Ingle, Jodie Barr, Dorie and Dave Banning, Kathy and Gary Webster, Pamela Shrum and Rob Hendry who all carried the team with me. These folks have done significant work for a second year to keep our grasslands healthy and beautiful. Thanks also to homeowners who have begun patrolling areas adjacent to their homes, which also keeps our open space free of the invading species.

Every weed that is pulled or dug keeps more herbicide out of our soils and waterways when those same weeds don't have to be sprayed. Our team also saves Ken-Caryl the costs of spraying. The targeted weeds have little benefit to native wildlife and decrease the available native food when they take over an area such as the South Valley Park owned by Jefferson County.

We've made good progress, but areas on the Cathy Johnson Trail open spaces owned by Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District that flank the South Valley Road and other areas are still in huge need. Willow Springs and West Ken-Caryl also have weed clubs so a healthy corridor of grasslands is being created and maintained. The work would go quickly if our team had more members so please consider joining our important work!

Inclusion Agreement Public Information Session

The Metropolitan District will be hosting a public information session on Jan. 10, 2022 regarding the Agreement for Inclusion of Property with North American Development Group (NADG), which governs the process for inclusion of the NADG property into Metropolitan District boundaries, and the transfer of the park and recreation facilities that NADG is building to the Metropolitan District. This agreement was approved by the Metropolitan District Board on Oct. 26, 2021 and by NADG on Nov. 4, 2021, and is currently in the process of implementation. Information regarding the Agreement for Inclusion of Property will be reviewed by District staff and legal counsel, and the community will be invited to ask questions they may have regarding the agreement and its implementation. 





Resident Joel Pankow Offers Chemistry Tutoring Services

Resident and volunteer bike patroller Joel Pankow continues to give back to our community, offering chemistry tutoring services. As a chemist, Joel founded Elemental Tutoring, LLC, (Chemistry Tutoring by a Chemist) after receiving numerous requests from students and their parents needing this specialized instruction.

Joel began tutoring chemistry via Zoom when COVID was as its peak last year, and decided to officially start his business this past summer.

"I decided to start this business because chemistry in high school and even college is a specialty subject with limited outside resources," explained Joel. Twenty years ago, we were driving around Denver and the surrounding areas looking for a neighborhood in which to buy a house, I remember driving into the valley with my wife and as we came along Valley Parkway, I noticed a lady with a white trash bag walking along the path near the stables picking up trash, I turned to my wife and said we need to find a house in this area as this is a neighborhood that takes pride in their community and looks after the environment.

Sadly, over the years I have seen a steady decline in the health of our open spaces and greenbelts.
