## Community Park Master Planning Process

The 2017 and 2021 Community Surveys both identified the need for a restroom at Community Park, to which the District wholeheartedly supports; however, there is more we need to consider than just a restroom when thinking about Community Park. The District acquired this 14-acre area when it signed the Bargain and Sale Deed on Dec. 31, 1991, with a



land developer who abandoned plans for housing. Via District funds and several joint venture grants through Jefferson County, the 14-acre park was planned and developed in 1992 and 1993. The park is nearing the 30th anniversary of its development, and it has served an incredible purpose for the community as one of the primary locations of athletics, including soccer and baseball. It is also home to one of the community's accessible playgrounds and an immensely popular picnic shelter. Its location next to Shaffer Elementary, and along several of the community's greenbelts, makes it a community hub for diverse activities.

As we look forward to the next 30 years of Community Park, the community will be asked to participate in a master planning process to not only look at how we use the park today, but how our children and grandchildren will use the park for the next 30 years. A master planning process will help us establish a long-range plan to help ensure that community resources are used effectively, and priorities are based on the greatest community benefit. Aligning the community's vision to the master plan will help to establish a clear plan of action and clearly identify the priorities that helped to establish that plan.

The process will kick off on the evening of Dec. 15, so mark your calendars for an open house at the Ranch House! You'll have the opportunity to stop by and talk directly with the staff and planners about your needs today and into

the future. We'll be developing a dedicated page on the Ken-Caryl Ranch website and will have updates in the weekly e-news and newspaper, so stay tuned for information about the first meeting and meetings to come. ## Master Association Board Adopts 2023 Budget with a \$4 Dues Increase

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board adopted the 2023 Budget at its Nov. 15 meeting. There will be a \$4 per month dues increase in 2023. The increase is needed for increased operational expenses, fire mitigation efforts and perimeter fence improvements. Approximately \$1 of the monthly dues increase will go toward fire mitigation, including interface mowing, home assessments and woody

## KCRMA Park Rangers **Spearhead Tree** Removal, Dec. 20

As part of the Master Association's commitment to resident safety, fire mitigation efforts and to improve overall community aesthetics, Ken-Caryl's open space staff will oversee the removal of several dead and dying trees at the entrance to the Valley at the intersection of Ken Caryl Ave. and South Valley Road. The work is scheduled for Dec. 20 and is being completed by Splintered Forest LLC.

This project will require a single lane closure into the Valley and has the potential to impact traffic, so residents are encouraged to plan accordingly when traveling to the Valley. The project is expected to be completed over several days, depending on weather and tree conditions.

## Watch for Wildlife, Avoid Collisions During Daylight Saving Time

Changing your clocks with your driving habits during daylight saving time can help prevent wildlife-vehicle collisions. Wildlife experts advise drivers that wildlife is on the move, so be aware, drive with caution and slow down at night.

As drivers set their clocks back an hour for daylight saving, they now experience dusk earlier and witness more wild animals migrating to their wintering habitats during rush-hour traffic on highways.

As the sunlight fades during highvolume commutes, Colorado Parks and Wildlife asks drivers to stay alert and share the roads with wildlife. Autumn is the peak seasonal mating and migration time for many species, so drivers should watch for wildlife as they begin to experience darker commutes.

The Colorado Department of Transportation also advises motorists to stay vigilant, drive with caution and slow down, as winter storms often push wildlife from the high country into lower elevations.

"With the changing seasons and snow already in the mountains, we are seeing a lot of deer and elk across our highways that motorists need to look out for," said CPW Assistant Area Wildlife Manager Steve McClung. "It is important for people to adhere to speed limits and remember that many of our highways have reduced speed limits from dusk until dawn to help prevent collisions with wildlife. Drivers should be aware of animals in town, on county roads, and on highways and to keep their eyes on the road and shoulders to help prevent dangerous collisions."

## Don't Leave Your Lunch to the Bears

The KCRMA Park Ranger staff have started installing food storage lockers at open space campsites. These secure lockers are designed to keep all wildlife, big and small, away from human food. This is part of an ongoing effort by the rangers to keep humans and bears safe while sharing the open space.



To date, the rangers have installed two of six food storage lockers at Bradford campgrounds and the Manor House. Staff expect to install food storage lockers at the remaining campsites at Tin Cup, Silver Cliff, North Hogback and Gothic Overlook in 2023. On some of the more remotely located lockers, you may notice one of the two compartments padlocked. The locked compartments are designated for use by the rangers to store fire suppression equipment and materials.

The food storage lockers are the same as found in national and state parks. To open the locker, simply reach inside to press a metal latch and the door will open. Be sure to close the door and make sure the latch secures properly to store your food items.

When using any of the campsites, please make sure to keep a clean camp and never leave food unattended. Please store all food products, unwashed cooking utensils, and even scented items such as sunscreen, toothpaste and deodorant in the secure food storage bins.

Storing food properly any time you are in the backcountry is important for several reasons:

- Failing to do so risks losing some or all your food to animals, or having your food contaminated by animals that can transmit diseases (mice, birds, squirrels, etc.).
- Improper food storage places you and your fellow campers at risk of physical harm by potentially aggressive animals, and rewards wildlife with food.
- Bears and other animals that become habituated to human food can become a nuisance, returning again and again to popular backcountry camping areas, which can become a threat to campers and residents.

Please pack out all trash and food scraps and do not leave any food or trash in the storage lockers when you depart the campsite. You can dispose of any trash in the bear-proof trash cans at campsites such as Bradford or along streetscape trash cans.

Rangers will bring out a limited number of trees, so each timeslot will have a good selection of recently cut Douglas Firs. Unlike the trees found in Christmas tree sale lots, these trees are more "natural" in shape, but they will fill your home with traditional Christmas spirit!

Secure your online reservation at www.ken-carylranch.org by clicking on the *Programs* tab and selecting Special Events from the drop-down menu. There will be plenty of time slots available. Please note that reservations are required; we will not be able to accept walk-ins at the event.

Rangers are accepting donations (cash, check or credit card) in exchange for the trees to offset expenses in the open space program. Limit one tree per family to ensure many families can enjoy this great tradition.

For the annual tree sale, the rangers harvest small diameter trees in the open space to improve wildlife habitat and overall forest health. The removal of the small trees reduces overcrowding and eliminates ladder fuels that can carry fire into a forest canopy. Trees that don't find a home are chipped and made into mulch.

## Cut-Your-Own-Christmas Tree Pilot Project

Cutting a Christmas tree in a national forest is a tradition for many families in our community. By cutting your own tree, you take an active part in managing your national forests! Now you can do it in our community's open space.

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Open Space Department, Open Space Committee and Board of Directors, in accordance with the Ken-Caryl Ranch Forest Stewardship Plan, has approved a Cut-Your-Own-Christmas Tree Pilot Project as a nice addition to the annual Christmas Tree harvest/sale at Ken-Caryl Ranch.

The pilot project will provide the community with an option to register for a permit, limited to 75 permits, one per family, to hike in the open space and cut a Christmas tree. The cost of the permit is \$10, and all proceeds will go to offsetting Open Space Department expenses.

The goal of the program is to take areas that are not as accessible to bulk forest operations and allow volunteers to cut their own trees in a designated area where regeneration of Douglas Fir

trees is reaching such a height that it begins to act as a ladder fuel for wildfire, generally, over 6 feet tall, and affects forest health due to the density of the amount of trees. Other trees may be found at the sites, including Aspen and Ponderosa Pines, as these trees are not part of the pilot project for removal by residents. The link below will identify Douglas Fir trees in pictures, which are soft, small, needled trees.

Guidelines for the program include the following:

- You must have a valid permit to cut and/or remove Douglas Fir trees in designated areas from Ken-Caryl Ranch open space. Boundaries of the Christmas tree cutting sites will be marked with flagging, "Timber Harvest Boundary" and several trees may have "Do Not Cut" flagging attached.
- You must stay within the designated cutting areas (see maps).
- No topping of Douglas Fir trees cut to size once the full tree has been felled.
- Cut below lowest live limb leave stumps no higher than six inches.
- Hand saw only, no gas or electric saws allowed.
- Avoid damage to other trees.
- No vehicles, bikes, or horses are


- allowed to transport trees in our open space. This will be for hikers only.
- Tree harvest dates; Nov. 19 Dec. 15.





NOTE - While cutting and transporting your own Christmas tree from open space is a rewarding and great way to spend time with family, please be aware that it requires intense physical exertion including, walking long distances, hiking off trail, and standing on uneven ground and steep slopes. Be prepared for snowy and icy conditions and cold temperatures. For safety, residents are encouraged to dress in layers and to take plenty of breaks, as needed.



## TABOR, ARPA and Developing the Jefferson County Budget

For some, the county budget may seem like nothing more than a thick pile of indecipherable numbers, detailed charts and spreadsheets. For us, it captures the community's funding priorities and how we best leverage taxpayer dollars to deliver county services. Like you, we must balance our budget every year while funding essential county services such as public safety, roads, bridges and other county operations.

Your voice is a critical part of building a county budget. We've increased ways for residents to share your thinking with us with the help of community meetings, an online budget survey, community budget forums, telephone town halls and our October budget hearing.

County Commissioners gather community feedback and work closely with other elected and appointed officials to develop a budget that prioritizes funding for critical services. The proposed 2023 general fund budget totals \$794 million. For example, it identifies \$155 million for public safety services provided by the sheriff, district attorney and coroner as well as \$83 million for maintenance and repair of county roads and bridges.

Our budget team presented the final budget on Tuesday, Nov. 15 at 8 a.m. in the Board of County Commissioners Hearing Room at 100 Jefferson County Parkway in Golden. To learn more, visit www.jeffco.us/meetings.

We were prepared to make up to \$20 million in potential budget cuts in the General Fund. The shortfall represents the difference between the growth allowed under TABOR and the increased cost to provide those services. But, thanks to COVID, recovery dollars from the American Rescue Plan Act – or ARPA funding – we temporarily avoided those cuts. APRA funding is only one-time money. We won't have this option in 2024.

When Jefferson County was awarded \$113 million in ARPA funds, the Jeffco ARPA Team began working with community members and elected officials to determine what is needed most to help the

Jefferson County community and local economy recover from COVID. After collecting extensive input, commissioners approved eight priority areas for ARPA funds. We created a task force for each priority area, then paired each task force with county subject matter experts.

Based on this feedback, Jefferson County will invest ARPA dollars in these one-time investment to:

- Offset economic impacts of the pandemic, including \$1.7 million for a food grant program addressing food insecurity and disruption to local food supply. Provide equitable access to locally produced food, while meeting nutritional and cultural needs.
- · Address needs for public health.
- Behavioral Health Vouchers expands the continuum of care
  for behavioral health services in
  Jefferson County through providing
  \$1 million in funding for a voucher
  program, allowing eligible residents
  to access services through private
  providers as well as Jefferson
  Center for Mental Health.
- Work with partners to enhance broadband infrastructure commissioned a study to determine broadband needs in the county.
   To increase the impact of ARPA funding at the county level, applications will be submitted for IIJA and state grants once priorities have been determined.
- Fund increased staffing in the county jail.
- Improve deputies' retirement package to help with better recruitment and retention.
- Repair and replace critical infrastructure, such as roads and culverts.
- Keep our community safe from wildfire threat, including increasing defensible space, improving forest health, hardening homes and creating two new year-round SLASH collection sites.
- Develop a 15-year housing master plan for Jefferson County with funds from the DOLA Innovative Housing Opportunities Program, combined with county direct ARPA funding. The focus of the master plan is to determine housing needs in the county.

In addition, Jefferson County will leverage the one-time use of ARPA funds to cover a \$20 million revenue shortfall in the General Fund. However, ARPA is only a temporary fix.

#### **TABOR Refund Checks**

The Taxpayer Bill of Rights (TABOR) requires governments in Colorado to refund revenue collected above the TABOR limit each year or seek voter approval to retain the revenue. For the second year in a row, property taxpayers in Jefferson County received TABOR refund checks in the mail. Taxpayers received these checks because the county garnered more revenue in 2021 than the TABOR revenue limits allowed.

One of the reasons Jefferson County is in its second year of refunding revenue is the unexpected impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2020, when the economy shut down, the county received much less revenue than normal, and this caused the calculation of the TABOR revenue limit to automatically reduce by \$14.5 million. Once that revenue limit is reset, the lower calculation sets the base for any allotted new growth.

The county must refund by law any revenue over this now lower threshold. Last year's total refund was about \$1.5 million. This year's refund is quite a bit more – \$17.3 million. Property taxpayers in the county received a check proportionate to the amount of property taxes paid in 2021. To learn more about TABOR and this year's refund, visit www.jeffco.us/tabor.

### Dear Editor:

This multi-generational mountain biker feels he has experienced a personal attack in your paper. Mr. Ryan Waldron mentions my name four times. I do not concur with any of the accusations. One sentence is particularly damaging. He stated: "Why does Mr. Fodor "wage a multiyear effort to eradicate mountain bikers from Ken-Caryl...?"That is not true. That was never my goal or intent. Continuing with the same sentence he adds: "...and scares our neighbors about mountain bikers". Our residents should be informed of incidents and open space accidents requiring emergency medical services without releasing names or private information. Serious mountain biking accidents are not generally published prominently in our newspaper. I feel this information is vital to the community. It supports the need for a safe area or "Conservation Area" for hikers and equestrians devoid of speeding mountain bikers. We need real balance in our open space.

Yes, mountain bike races have been conducted in Ken-Caryl over a decade ago before Mr. Ryan Waldron was a resident. The races continued for seven years before being discontinued. It left a lingering scar for those who were in opposition. I hope Mr. Waldron, as a family member with ties to the Avout Racing Inspired Juniors organization, along with the leadership, will agree and say, "never again". I feel the Avout program has been well supervised and special for those children who are interested; however, some adult parents have views which contradict those of some vocal conservationists.

The letter asserts that there are hundreds of mountain bikers in Ken-Caryl. That is a small fraction of over 4,000 households and 14,000+ residents with a majority who do not mountain bike. Shouldn't KCR designate a meaningful portion of the Foothills Open Space, (recommend one/third), as a conservation area in compliance with the survey results? Will Avout leadership and membership agree? Our KCR Trail Plan features the Stacked Loop System, which causes fragmentation and wildlife habitat compression. The plan has caused controversy since its inception. I urge everyone to read about fragmentation. It is a problem throughout the country.
