In early September, the Master Association announced the beginning of a General Manager search to identify the next leader of the Ken-Caryl Master Association following Victoria DeSair's resignation in August. After an extensive search process led by the Board of Directors and Human



Resources, we are pleased to announce that Brian Yowell has been selected as General Manager, beginning Oct. 31.

The Hiring Process Committee received more than 30 applications from candidates across the country for the General Manager position. Over the past 8 weeks, the committee conducted a rigorous and thorough process of reviewing these applications and holding multiple stages of interviews with well-qualified candidates. Multiple MA staff members also participated and provided feedback during various stages of this process.

On Oct. 24, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board held its regular meeting and discussed the following items:

Master Association Board Considering \$4 Dues Increase

At the Oct. 10 Board Strategy and Budget Summit, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board determined that the strategic objectives for 2023 are:

- Aesthetics: Perimeter fences, tree replacement/ management, paved trails, median enhancement, water conservation, irrigation, and neighborhood
- Fire Mitigation: 10-foot interface mowing, perimeter fences, wood vegetation removal, SLASH removal, Firewise education, mitigation training for staff, alignment of Firewise strategies with documentation.
- Human Resources: Develop goals, regular feedback, progress assessment, staff development plan, market analysis and salary alignment.
- New Development Compliance: Architectural control and covenants.
- Open Space: Comprehensive plan review strategic effort, conserve and protect, recreation.

With the 2023 strategic objectives in mind, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board reviewed a draft of the 2023 Budget at its Oct. 24 meeting. The Board gave further direction on budget for 2023 and is considering a \$4 per month dues increase to cover increased operational expenses, fire mitigation efforts and perimeter fence improvements in 2023. Approximately \$1 of the monthly dues increase will go toward fire mitigation, including interface mowing, home assessments and woody vegetation removal. Approximately \$3 per month will go toward perimeter fence improvements. A revised draft budget based on the Board's initial feedback has been posted at www.ken-carylranch.org under the About Us tab, then Financials. Some proposed operating cost increases in 2023 include:

- Administrative Staff Updates
- Cost of Living Adjustments for Staff
- **Facility Maintenance Expenses**
- **Insurance Premium Expenses**
- Trash/Recycling Services
- · Water Utility Rates

In addition to these operational expenditures, the Master Association Board is planning on funding Brannon Gearhart Pond Dredging and Median Enhancement. The Master Association Board will further discuss the 2023 budget at its Nov. 15 Board meeting at 6 p.m. at the Ranch House and via Zoom. The Board is planning to adopt the budget on Nov. 15. If you have any questions or comments about the draft budget, contact General Manager Brian Yowell briany@kcranch.org. The Metropolitan District is also in the process of drafting its 2023 budget. The Metropolitan District will begin its budget process and open the first public meeting at the Nov. 14 Metropolitan District Board meeting at 3:30 p.m. at the Ranch House or via Zoom. Cut-Your-Own-**Christmas Tree Pilot Project**

Cutting a Christmas tree in a national forest is a tradition for many families in our community. By cutting your own tree, you take an active part in managing your national forests! Now you can do it in Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space.

• RANGER FIELD NOTES

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Open Space Department, Open Space Committee, and Board of Directors in accordance with the Ken-Caryl Ranch Forest Stewardship Plan, has approved a Cut-Your-Own-Christmas Tree Pilot Project as a nice addition to the annual Christmas Tree harvest/sale at Ken-Caryl Ranch.

The pilot project will provide the community with an option to register for a permit, limited to 75 permits, three per family, to hike in the open space and cut a Christmas tree. The cost of the permit is \$10 for up to three trees, and all proceeds will go to offsetting Open Space Department expenses.

The goal of the program is to take areas that are not as accessible to bulk forest operations and allow volunteers to cut their own trees in a designated area where regeneration of Douglas Fir trees is reaching such a height that it begins to act as a ladder fuel for wildfire, generally, over 6 feet tall, and affects forest health due to the density of the amount of trees. Other trees may be found at the sites, including Aspen and Ponderosa Pines, as these trees are not part of the pilot project for removal by residents. These trees are soft, small, needled trees.

Guidelines for the program include the following:

- You must have a valid permit to cut and/or remove Douglas Fir trees in designated areas from Ken-Caryl Ranch open space. Boundaries of the Christmas tree cutting sites will be marked with flagging, "Timber Harvest Boundary" and several trees may have "Do Not Cut" flagging attached.
- · You must stay within the designated cutting areas (see maps).
- No topping of Douglas Fir trees cut to size once the full tree has been felled.
- · Cut below lowest live limb leave stumps no higher than six inches.
- Hand saw only, no gas or electric saws allowed.
- Avoid damage to other trees.
- · No vehicles, bikes, or horses are allowed to transport trees in Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space. This will be for hikers only.
- Tree harvest dates; Nov. 19 Dec. 15. What a great way to support your Open Space Department and receive a beautiful tree for your holiday! If cutting your own Christmas tree is not your cup of tea, please remember to support the annual Christmas Tree sale at Dakota Lodge on Dec. 3.



KCR Christmas Tree Sale, Dec. 3: Reservations Required

Get into the holiday spirit with a fresh cut Christmas tree! The annual Christmas Tree Sale will be held at the Dakota Lodge on Saturday, Dec. 3 from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. A simple reservation system will be used again this year so that everyone can skip the line and enjoy a peaceful Christmas tree experience!

Reservations will be available in 30-minute timeslots. There will be 30 openings for each 30-minute timeslot to provide easier parking and a stress-free space for you and your family to choose your tree.

Rangers will bring out a limited amount of trees, so each timeslot will have a good selection of recently cut Douglas Firs. Unlike the trees found in Christmas tree sale lots, these trees are more "natural" in shape, but they will fill your home with traditional Christmas spirit!

Register online beginning Nov. 15 at 8 a.m. at www.ken-carylranch.org by clicking on the *Programs* tab and selecting Special Events from the drop-down menu. There will be plenty of time slots available. Reservations are required we will not be able to accept walk-ins at the event.

Rangers are accepting donations (cash, check or credit card) in exchange for the trees to offset expenses in the open space program. Limit one tree per family to ensure many families can enjoy this great tradition.

For the annual tree sale, the Rangers harvest small diameter trees in the open space to improve wildlife habitat and overall forest health. The removal of the small trees reduces overcrowding and eliminates ladder fuels that can carry fire into a forest canopy. Trees that don't find a home are chipped and made into mulch.

Jefferson County will proceed with installation of the raised crosswalks on Valley Parkway at White Oak Drive and Valley Parkway at Mountain Laurel Drive







2023 MD Budget **Process**

Every year and every budget process are different. The Metropolitan District has fortunately built a fund balance (revenues less expenses) that allows the budget to endure the current challenging economic conditions, ongoing employee recruitment and retention challenges, and the increased cost of doing business. As the Board continues to plan for the future and the ongoing care and maintenance of our amenities, the Board will begin discussions on long-term funding strategies. These discussions, along with annual budget discussions, will occur at the Nov. 14 and Dec. 6 board meetings. Please note, neither of these meetings are on the District's traditional 4th Tuesday of the month to accommodate statutory budget requirements and holiday schedules. Both meetings include a public hearing specific to the 2023 budget, so we encourage the public to get informed by reviewing the draft budget posted to the Ken-Caryl Ranch website. As always, we encourage participation at the meetings as well. 

One mountain biker who rides on our trails viewpoint: First, in response to Mr. Fodor's Letter to the Editor on Oct. 26 - mountain bike races may have occurred in our neighborhood well over a decade ago, but no one or any group has been since then or is currently working on organizing any races on our trails. All Ken-Caryl newspapers from 2010 onward have not had any mentions of any races (I have looked at copies). Second – there's zero racing that happens, or has happened, since 2009 on our trails. Mr. Fodor notes in his Oct. 26 letter that "I and others feel mountain bike racing is bad business for Ken-Caryl...", but how can it be bad business when it doesn't even happen? Why does Mr. Fodor (as a self-proclaimed mountain biker) wage a multi-year effort to eradicate mountain bikers from Ken-Caryl and scare our neighbors about mountain bikers? I've never met a mountain biker that has attempted to do so much damage to the mountain bike community and sport that they participate in like Mr. Fodor has done over the past several years. There are hundreds of mountain bikers in Ken-Caryl, and we will continue to see that number grow. Ken-Caryl Mountain bikers are men, women, kids, parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles. The Ken-Caryl mountain bike community enjoys the camaraderie, fitness, and mental well-being that is realized through being outside and doing regular mountain biking on our trails. Mr. Fodor, on behalf of the Ken-Caryl mountain bike community – we welcome you with open arms to our tribe and would love to ride with you, collaborate with you in the woods in building the Wild Cat Trail as described in the master trail plan, discuss how to designate a conservation area, and join with you in the realization that mountain biking, trail building, and conservation can occur simultaneously - as has been done for decades across the country from Vermont to California. All it takes is a community that's open-minded and can have a thoughtful discussion on how to accomplish objectives that serve the needs of the entire community.
