



• RANGER FIELD NOTES

Warning: Thin Ice on Ponds During the Winter!

As we enter March, which is also historically the snowiest month for Colorado, we would like to remind everyone that it is never a good idea to traverse ice covered ponds, even if they seem solid enough to walk on.

There are three ponds located in Ken-Caryl Ranch, including Dakota Lodge Pond, Brannon-Gearhart Pond and Settlement Pond near Shaffer Elementary

School, and all three have operating aerators. However, from November to April, we turn off the aerators at the Dakota Lodge and Brannon-Gearhart ponds to allow them to fully freeze, as the partially frozen water can be a hazard to big game animals. They could potentially fall through the ice as they attempt to cross, or drink the water, and may become trapped. Even if these ponds look completely frozen, residents should always stay off the ice.

Due to the fast-changing temperatures and sunny days in between our snowstorms, the ice can be deceptively thin and will not support weight, and the middle of the pond may not be as thick as the sides if water is circulating underneath.

The partially frozen surface of the ponds is even an attractant to dogs. Please avoid playing with pets near frozen ponds as a thrown stick or ball could result in your pet falling through the ice. Many accidents occur from people trying to rescue pets.

Be sure to talk to your children about these concerns and to inform them of Ken-Caryl Ranch Open Space Rule #13, which states "Ice skating and ice fishing and walking upon any ice is prohibited". If you have any questions, feel free to call the KCRMA Rangers at 303-979-1876, ext. 170.

If you are interested in running for one of the open board seats, the deadline for filing your Self Nomination and Acceptance Form with the Designated Election Official (DEO) is Feb. 24, no later than 5 p.m. The deadline to file affidavit of intent to be a write-in candidate with the DEO is Feb. 27, no later than 5 p.m. This year's MD Board election will take place on May 2. Please stay tuned to this publication for more information to come.







Superhighways... Predominantly, I don't see a soul when perusing many miles of trail during an outing. To the "multi-generational bikers," try going to Green Mountain on any given Saturday for some actual perspective. Calling the KC trails a "superhighway" is a ludicrous over exaggeration with zero real world comparative observation.

Dear Editor:

There has been so much money spent developing the 'Stacked Loop Trail System' from north to south in the Foothills Open Space. It is such an excessive and fragmenting, invasive system and requires more trail. It divides the land into pieces, constricts wildlife habitat, crosses water sources more often and forces senior citizens, me, to walk further. It is generally accompanied by wide switchbacks with rounded corners, which are not desired by hikers. Often hikers will create a social trail as a shortcut, thus defeating the purpose of keeping users on the trail.

- * The Docmann Trail should never have been built in its present form.
- * The flat trail path on the east comes within 6/10 mile from the golden eagle nesting site.
- * Mountain bikers go very fast here.
- * The switchbacks on the west penetrate deep into the raptor foraging area.

Then some people doubt why the golden eagle nest failed in each of the four years since this trail was activated. All of the open space is special. All trail users deserve to feel safe on all open space trails. Docmann Trail statistics from 2019 to 2020 reveal the mountain bike traffic out-numbers hiker traffic by 20 to one. This area will come to life again with raptor populations increasing and elk migrations returning. All that needs to be done is reduce the stressful biking activity in the area. The area south of Massey Draw was referenced in two biological reports as a Potential Conservation Area. The trails in this area would be open to pedestrians and equestrians exclusively and for the sake of safety and rejuvenating the wildlife population, this area would be closed to mountain bikers. I believe that this area of open space will be a favorite place for members of family who don't mountain bike and those who would just want to take a casual walk without a bell ringing at them or hearing a loud noise 'right,' translation: 'move over.'
