Voting in the 2022 MD **Board Election**

Another election? Yes, Ken-Caryl Ranch is having an election! This one is different, however. The Master Association election was conducted in March and was for the Master Association Board of Directors. The current election is for the Metropolitan District Board of Directors, which is effectively the parks and recreation provider for Ken-Caryl Ranch. Because there is confusion about the current election, we thought

we would highlight answers to some of your routinely asked questions: Why can't I vote online? Special Districts are required to conduct either in-

person or mail-in elections, so online voting is not possible. When will I receive my ballot? By now, you should have received your ballot

in the mail. If you haven't, please email elections@crsofcolorado.com.

Where can I drop off my ballot? There are only TWO locations to drop off your ballot: Community Resource Services of Colorado, 7995 East Prentice Avenue, Suite 103E, or the Ranch House during normal business hours, Monday - Thursday from 9 a.m. – 4 p.m.

Is there a 24-hour drop box for ballots? No, there is no 24-hour drop box. The Ranch House is open during normal business hours, Monday - Thursday from 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. and extended hours from 7 a.m. - 7 p.m. on election day, May 3.

Can I use the mail slot at the Ranch House to the left of the front doors to drop off my ballot? Please do not use this mail slot as it is not an official ballot box. Utilize the ballot box located inside the Ranch House which is open during normal business hours, Monday - Thursday from 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. and extended hours from 7 a.m. – 7 p.m. on election day, May 3.

Why are there so many seats open for this election? There are two, threeyear terms available that are part of the District's normal terms. In addition, two Board members elected in May of 2020 relocated outside Metropolitan District boundaries, so there are two, one-year terms available to fill those positions.

Weed Warrior Kickoff Sunday, May 1

Who: All community members are welcome to join the Weed Warriors Club to tackle noxious weeds in our open space. We will be learning techniques from our own Ken-Caryl Ranger and Natural Resource Specialist Liam Cullinane on how to target mullein, scotch thistle, musk thistle, diffuse knapweed and others all summer long. Eagle Scouts and other groups looking for volunteer hours are welcome too!

What to bring: A pointed shovel, thick gloves, high boots, sunscreen and water.

When: Sunday, May 1 at 10 a.m. for the kick-off, but from then on, every Thursday and the first Sunday of every month throughout the summer. Meetings are at 8:30 a.m. until July when they will begin at 8 a.m. No commitment necessary; just drop in whenever you can and stay for as long as vou want.

Where: Meet for the kick-off at the Bradford Pool parking lot. We will be walking to the large rock out crops nearby for the training.

Why: Controlling invasive weeds is an important part of land management and is necessary to





protect native species, which are vital to the health of the ecosystems. While herbicide application is an important tool in noxious weed management, using multiple control methods is the most effective strategy, including hand removal. Last summer, the Weed Warriors volunteered 325 hours to dig and pull over 45,000 weeds in Ken-Caryl's open space, but there's more work to be done. As a team, let's beat that number this year! Please join us in keeping our precious grasslands healthy and beautiful!

See Something, Say Something!

We've all heard the sayings, "It takes a village," or, "The whole is greater than the sum of its parts," or, "Alone we can do so little; together we can do so much."

The message of these sayings rings true for so many situations in life, business and community. Together we can do so much. We are all incredibly lucky to live in Ken-Caryl Ranch and be part of a community that cares about the community.

Covenant (or rules) inspections are done one time a month, per residence – at a minimum - during the winter months, and two times a month, per residence – at a minimum – during the spring, summer and fall months. Additionally, any time a home sells in our community, I do a physical inspection of the exterior of the home to make sure there are not any outstanding violations that would need to be cured. If there are, I collaborate with the sellers to cure, or communicate, with the buyers that the outstanding violation(s) will need to be addressed and give them a timeline in which cure is expected.

As I can't be everywhere at the same time (the thought of cloning me is either very exciting or terrifying), I also rely on members of the community to alert me to potential rules violations and concerns. I personally respond to every inquiry and follow up with the necessary actions if cure is required, and work with individual residents to find a solution to the violation.

I'm going to coin my own saying... "Alone we can only do so much; together we can do so much more."

I know that nobody – okay, okay, not many – want to complain about their neighbors, but unfortunately, sometimes it is necessary. Oftentimes, people don't know exactly what is and what isn't a violation, and don't necessarily think their actions impact their neighbors and community, or don't think the rules apply to them, or their backyards. However, as we all know, the rules, regulations and procedures are in place to keep Ken-Caryl looking great, our property values up and our residents accountable.

If you see something, say something. We have added a Rule Enforcement Request Form to our website, under the *About Us* tab, then click Contact Us. This form will come directly to me, and I will follow up on the request and you can remain anonymous.

Don't think of it as not caring about your neighbor... think of it as caring about your neighborhood. Together, we can educate, enforce and ensure Ken-Caryl stays beautiful.

2022 Jeffco SLASH Collection Sites

Jefferson County is excited to announce that the number of SLASH collection days will be doubled in 2022 compared to previous years. SLASH collections will now be open Thursday through Sunday at most locations for the drop off of items like tree branches, debris, pine needles and pinecones. Jeffco will host several collection sites in Beaver Ranch Park in Conifer and Settlers Drive Property in Morrison in the coming months. Any size truck or trailer is welcome at Jefferson County SLASH Collection sites. Dump fees are based on six cubic yards (162 cubic feet) of material, which is one load. The cost to drop off a single load is \$20. Credit cards only. Volunteer Patroller Training & Checking for Bracelets

In the next couple of weeks, nine residents will have joined the KCR Volunteer Patroller Program. This brings the number of patrollers to 32 for the 2022 season! This program is beginning its eleventh year and the volunteers are a tremendous help to the rangers. In 2021, Volunteer Patrollers contacted 5,008 users, patrolled 1,018 trails and donated over 600 hours of patrol time!



In becoming a volunteer patroller, one attends an initial 2.5-hour training that includes contact scenarios. Volunteer Patrollers, or VPs, are trained on many aspects, but the major one is making a professional contact. This includes an introduction/gaining the users' attention, a reason for stopping the user, educating users on subject matter, or any rule violation and a positive closing. The contact scenario training attempts to review all types of possible contacts in the field. What complicates matters is that VPs (along with park rangers) have to verify Ken-Caryl residency by either viewing an ID bracelet on the person, or bike, or stopping the user to verify membership. Depending on the amount of time with a hiker/runner/biker, it may be a few seconds to a quarter second at best, to try and view a bracelet. If the bracelet is not on the front of a bike or person, like a backpack/wrist, VPs are stopping the trail user to verify membership by asking them for an address (possibly a family name to check records). VPs try their best to approach trail users in a positive manner, and the job is difficult as it takes many hours of practicing contacts to become proficient. VPs are always trying to educate, and also identify, any non-Ken-Caryl members (trespassers) and direct them to leave the private trails. This is different from being a volunteer patroller/ host at a public open space/park agency, as one is not stopping or directly contacting every user on the trails or parks.

KCR Residents, please do your part too!

- If you have the KCR ID Bracelet (yellow), attach the bracelet on your wrist, front of pack, dog leash, or handlebars!
- Please <u>do not</u> place the bracelet in your pocket, attach to backside of backpack (hat or helmet), or under your bike seat, in the wheel hub, neck/stem, etc. With limited time to verify a bracelet when oncoming trail users appear,

having it displayed correctly is the best way for a VP or park ranger to recognize an authorized user. After viewing the bracelet, VPs can offer a simple verbal thank you, wave, or thumbs up sign. Another, crucial part is that VPs (and park rangers) have to also <u>view</u> the bracelet text, symbol, or serial number, to actually make sure it is an approved bracelet and not someone with just the same color bracelet trying to commit fraud. In addition, if a bracelet is not observed, VPs will stop the trail user to confirm residency.

VPs (who wear a blue vest, an ID with a black/silver patch and orange bike placard) are authorized to contact users on the trail system. Trail users do not have to answer questions from other non-VPs/park rangers, or basically other trail users if approached, unless they feel comfortable to do so. However, these individuals are not authorized, or trained by the open space team to perform contacts. Please remember, the VPs are **donating their free time** and are not paid. They are helping to educate users on all rules of the open space, working to keep out trespassers and doing their part to assist the community in keeping Ken-Caryl Ranch a great place to live. Notice to Trail Users: Singletrack Trails to Conduct Maintenance Work

The KCRMA Rangers have enlisted the help of contractor Singletrack Trails to perform maintenance work on our two-track service/trail roads on April 20. They will be starting on the west side of the North Hogback Trail and then will move to South Colorow Trail. Singletrack Trails will be cleaning out drainage dips and grading the road to help with rutting and water run-off. The ranger staff will post signs to alert trail users of the maintenance work. 

Noxious Weed Work in Ken-Caryl's Open Space

Springtime has arrived in the Valley, bringing longer days and warmer temperatures. With this warmer weather, noxious weeds are starting to pop up in the open spaces, lawns and parks. The Natural Resource team began their noxious weed management work in the open space earlier this month. This includes herbicide application, biological control, hand removal and mowing. We will continue these operations all the way through fall. In addition to the Natural Resource team, a contract herbicide applicator, Weed Wranglers, will also be conducting work in the open space that will continue into the summer and fall.

We are required by Colorado law to manage noxious weeds in our open space areas. To manage them, we take an integrative approach that uses multiple control methods to combat noxious weed spread. 2022 MD Board Election: What You Need to Know

This year's MD Board election is underway and closes May 3 at 7 p.m. Residents will have the opportunity to vote to fill four open seats on the MD Board; four candidates to fill two one-year terms and six candidates to fill two three-year terms. Voting in this election is by MAIL-IN BALLOT ONLY, not online. Ballots were mailed to eligible electors of the District, beginning April 11 – April 18. Ballots may be dropped off or mailed to the locations listed on the ballot. Ballots may be dropped off INSIDE the Ranch House DURING NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS, Monday - Thursday from 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. It is up to the elector to ensure their ballot is received by 7 p.m. on Election Day. Postmark dates will not be accepted. 





Ken-Caryl Ranch thanks Pat for his years of dedication, service and commitment to our community and to





Ken-Caryl Ranch Historical Society Fire Site Team Surveys the Oak Fire Site

On Dec. 27, 2021, a significant wildfire burned a large portion of the east side of the Ken-Caryl Ranch South Hogback. The fire was named the Oak Fire. Archaeological research in a number of states have discovered that a fire scar, before natural vegetation has time to recover, is a most productive place to do an archaeological survey, as surface artifacts are the most visible.

On April 6, a Ken-Caryl Ranch Historical Society (KCRHS) Lead Team conducted an archaeological survey of the Oak Fire burn scar. The team consisted of 15 people; 10 from the Historical Society, two Ken-Caryl Ranch Rangers and three experienced Colorado Archaeological Society archaeologists. The following is the report of that effort.

The KCRHS team, with cooperation from the KCRMA Rangers and experts from the Colorado Archaeological Society, took advantage of the opportunity to conduct an archaeological survey presented by the Oak Fire burn scar before the vegetation grew dense. The property, particularly west of the Dakota Hogback, has seen considerable past archaeological work. Hundreds of prehistoric artifacts have been found and recorded. Compared to other sites on Ken-Caryl Ranch land to the west of the Dakota Hogback and the three cuts in the hogback at Deer Creek, Massey Draw (Ken Caryl Avenue) and Dutch Creek, the density of artifacts found on this survey was low. It appears that the prehistoric and historic people did not use this eastern hogback slope to the high degree they used the west hogback slope and the Valley.





"The other way to damage trails is by causing deep footprints (or hoofprints) and tire tracks. Mountain bikes create grooves that allow water to stream down the trail. The bike actually creates a channel that water goes down and

carries the trail surface,"...explained Bonnell.

Trail damage causes open space managers to spend resources to repair trails. Vivienne Jannatpour, Boulder County Open Space stated, "It costs money and time to go in and smooth it (the trails) out." Jannatpour is pleased that by educating the public, "we are starting to see more and more support, and even people asking us to close trails."

Never venture off trails. "You're not just killing the plants, you're killing the experience," Bonnell said. "Who wants to walk on a 20-foot-wide trail? No one! We love a nice corridor with vegetation and beautiful wildflowers. When you walk off trail, no matter what time of year, you're jeopardizing that trail experience."


Ken-Caryl Open Space Management has not initiated these important trail closures. Ken-Caryl Open Space trails are not closed dusk to dawn, even though the 2021 Community Survey indicated that 27% of respondents were

in favor of nighttime closures. Ken-Caryl Trails are not closed "to protect wildlife during sensitive times during their lifecycles." Trails are not posted at the trailheads with signage "closed" for the season for muddy conditions. As evidence of what Bonnell was referring to in her previous quote regarding trail degradation, please visit the Cathy Johnson Trail from Deer Creek Canyon Road. The CJ trail has evolved into a trail wide enough for a two-way road and the adjacent vegetation is struggling.

Doesn't it seem irresponsible that the Ken-Caryl community is not following the necessary standards set by JeffCo and Boulder Open Space and offering our wildlife the highest degree of respect and protection, as well as preserving the integrity of our trails?

Trail closures are necessary. To be the best stewards of our open space and wildlife, please request Ken-Caryl open space managers to initiate nighttime trail closures and post seasonal trail closures on the K/C web site and at trailheads.
