Understanding the Master Association and Metropolitan District

Understanding the Master Association and Metropolitan District

In the last edition of the newspaper, you learned about the differences between the Master Association and the Metropolitan District in an article written by Master Association Executive Director Victoria DeSair. Now that you know Ken-Caryl Ranch is governed by two distinct entities, one public and one private, let's

explore some additional details for the public side of the community. The Metropolitan District is a government entity known as a Special District managed by a five-member elected Board and paid professional staff. Approximately two-thirds of the District's revenues are derived from property taxes, while users' fees, grants and other revenue make up the remainder. In simplistic terms, the Master Association, or the HOA arm of the community funded by monthly dues, owns most of the property within the community. Meanwhile, the District operates most of these amenities. This means the District provides all recreation programs and maintains the Community Center, tennis courts, parks, pools, fields and hard surface greenbelts. Because the District utilizes property tax revenues to maintain and operate these amenities, even though many of them aren't owned by the Metropolitan District, they must be open to the general public, and that includes residents outside of Ken-Caryl Ranch.

Now that we have established most Ken-Caryl Ranch amenities are public, you may be wondering about fees. The District currently utilizes a two-tiered fee structure, which imposes 20 percent higher fees on non-residents; however, the District must be able to demonstrate that the higher non-resident fee bears some reasonable relationship to the costs of operating and maintaining the amenities. The District Board will be discussing this topic further this summer as a precursor to the 2023 budget process.

C-470 and Ken Caryl Intersection Improvement Updates

Beep, beep! The Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) began intersection improvement work at the intersection of C-470 and Ken Caryl Avenue on Monday, March 21. The project is scheduled to run through late August 2022. Project improvements include:

- Removal and replacement of the traffic signals along both directions and both sides of Ken Caryl Avenue at C-470.
- Improving the ramps from both eastbound and westbound C-470 onto Ken Caryl Avenue (Exit 10) by adding left turn capacity for motorists who are exiting C-470 and turning left onto Ken Caryl Avenue. This will help prevent left-turn traffic from backing up at these exits.
 Widening the right turn lanes from Ken Caryl Avenue onto both directions of C-470.

Construction Update! Hard Hats Not Required – Well, Maybe!

As I drive around Ken-Caryl Ranch, it's looking a little like Fraggle Rock with all the "Doozers doing what Doozers do".

Painting, building, mowing, planting, roofing, rocking...and maybe a little rolling as well. With all the goings-on, I thought it was a good time to refresh you on a few key things to take



- into consideration while planning your next "Doozer" project.
- Although construction trailers, roll-aways, pods and bagsters are allowed on your property during active construction, please plan accordingly and ensure that the delivery (and pick up) of these pieces of equipment is well timed with the start – and ending – of your project. Any such item left on property for an extended period of time is deemed unsightly and could result in a violation, which are usually delivered by Gobo, the pragmatic Fraggle.
- 2) If you border open space and wish to utilize said open space to access your property, deliver materials, or complete your project, please remember you need to fill out an Open Space Access Form prior to doing so. You can do so by visiting our Home Improvement page on the website, which leads me right into my next reminder...
- 3) All exterior improvements need to be approved by the Architectural Committee prior to the project beginning. If you are simply maintaining your property, you don't need approval. If you are doing a new improvement project, replacing something, or repainting something then yes, you need approval. And, yes, even if it's in the backyard.
- 4) Please be conscious of your neighbors and community during your projects. Be mindful of where your crews park, the noise your project may create and the mess it may leave. Please pick up construction materials and tools on a daily basis and ensure that the job site is kept clean and organized. Also please ensure that you don't block in your neighbor...no matter how you feel about them...and that your project doesn't create a dangerous situation for drivers, pedestrians, dogs and children.
- 5) Once your pre-approved (like how I snuck that in?) project is completed, please let me know so I can close out your job.

Calling Rangers with Wildlife Concerns

Ken-Caryl Ranch Park Rangers have received a few injured wildlife calls in the past few weeks. When a wildlife injury call is received, rangers may investigate as time allows or determine over the phone if the animal should be left alone to "let nature take its course". If the injury is minor for a small mammal or bird, our advice may also be to take it to a licensed rehabilitator.

The KCRMA Rangers use the same policy as Colorado Parks and Wildlife. If a deer or elk is injured, but can still feed

and walk on its own, then we "let nature take its course." However, if the deer or elk is injured to the point it cannot feed or walk on its own, listing to one side, head/ears lowered, then the rangers will respond to euthanize the animal (if on duty), or direct the caller to contact Colorado Parks and Wildlife.

- PARK RANGERS will only handle deer or elk. As time allows, a report of an injured or sick deer will be reviewed and any dead deer will be removed as soon as possible, depending on the time of day and availability of a park ranger on duty. Many factors play into the response time, including where the ranger is on duty, trails, proximity to a truck, time of day, etc.
- JEFFERSON COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL (303-271-5070) will remove any dead animals and advise residents on any other injured animals, for example, rabbits, squirrels, raccoons, etc.

Park Rangers keep a call log when reports come in referencing sightings and/or concerns about animals in our open space and private property. The log assists the rangers in detecting a pattern of behavior or injured activity of a certain animal and can report that information to follow-up calls by staff, Colorado Wildlife Officers, or Ken-Caryl Ranch residents.

Due to infectious diseases and calls in the past, park rangers will advise residents to contact Jefferson County Animal Control and they may assist with any concerns and/or advise them to call the Jefferson County Health Department or Colorado Parks and Wildlife as well. Tax Breaks for Wildfire Mitigation

Wildfire mitigation can be pricey, so it's important for homeowners to take advantage of tax and insurance breaks. In Ken-Caryl Ranch, the breaks include the Colorado State Income Tax Credit for Wildfire Mitigation and insurance discounts for fire-resistant roofs.

The Colorado Income Tax Code allows a homeowner to subtract as much as \$2,500 from their tax bill this year for wildfire mitigation (https://tax. colorado.gov/sites/tax/files/Income65. pdf). The taxpayer can claim 50 percent of the direct cost for removing, or thinning trees and brush, around a home in the fire prone WUI, or Wildland Urban Interface. The boundaries for the WUI can be confusing, even to state tax collectors, so they check with the Colorado State Forest Service about whether a claim is legitimate. "We try to be as flexible as possible," says Carolyn Aspelin of CSFS, "but a claim for a new riding lawn mower to trim your suburban lawn might not be approved."

The tax credit application requires a receipt from a contractor, and it cannot include claims for the homeowner's time or in-kind contributions from friends.

Aspelin says the code is flexible about tax credits for home improvements. Scrapping your old wooden shingles can qualify for the \$2,500 tax reduction, and insurance changes can cut costs even more.

Insurance Agent Virginia Hooper says State Farm and other insurance companies offer discounts specifically for replacing cedar shake and asphalt composite roofs with hail- and fire-resistant metal or cement tiles. "State Farm also inspects or reviews inspections of homes in fire-prone areas for other improvements," she says. "The results can lead to lower premiums for homes with fire-resistant features such as exterior stucco, if the stucco covers a fire-resistant base."

The author of this article replaced a hail damaged asphalt composite roof with steel shingles nine years ago. The roofing discounts since then have reduced insurance payments by \$6,800. After accounting for the \$2,000 deductible and routine premium increases of \$1,400, the roof has reduced total insurance costs by more than \$3,400.

Hooper says there are no specific homeowner's discounts for removing brush or flammable fencing, but those factors can be considered when an owner requests a re-evaluation of his/her coverage. She says many homeowners are opting to increase their coverage because of fire danger and rising construction costs. There is no blanket guarantee for the cost of replacing a home.

Exterior changes to a Ken-Caryl Ranch home require approval from the Ken-Caryl Ranch Architectural Committee.







Resident Sarah Manion Battles Ovarian Cancer with Competitive **Spirit and Positive** Attitude

Ken-Caryl Resident Sarah Manion is a Colorado native who loves the outdoors and is always up for a challenge. Last year, the 54-year-old Ken-Caryl resident skied 70 days finishing out the season with a few spring powder days after learning that she had stage IV ovarian cancer in late March. So, when she heard that the Colorado Ovarian Cancer Alliance (COCA) was hosting Jodi's Race for Awareness, the nonprofit's annual 5K/1-mile run and walk that takes place the second Saturday in June, she was determined to participate. Even though she signed up just two weeks before the 2021 race, and that she was scheduled for surgery a few days after the event, she rallied a team, had a team logo created and raised \$12,000 in donations for COCA.

Sarah was shocked when she learned that she had late-stage ovarian cancer. She's always led a healthy lifestyle, was rarely sick and had no family history of the disease. Her doctor originally did a colonoscopy when she complained of bloating, weight gain and bowel changes. When that came out clean, she figured the symptoms were just related to getting older. Eventually, her need to urinate became so frequent that it disrupted her life, so she went to her gynecologist and insisted they run some tests, which revealed the cancer.

Jennifer Manta, a former Ken-Caryl resident who helped Jodi Brammeier start Jodi's Race in 2010, connected Sarah with COCA. She joined a Nicki's Circle support group and immediately felt connected to the other women in the group. "It helps you to not feel so alone because you know these women get it - they've been through the same things I've gone through," says Sarah. She also began meeting with a peer mentor, who was able to offer guidance and advice from her own 12-year journey with ovarian cancer and turned to COCA for information and resources to better understand the disease and treatment options. When she learned that one of the ongoing cancer drugs recommended by her medical team costs as much as \$16,000 each month, she worked with COCA's Carol's Wish financial navigators to ensure that she was enrolled in an insurance plan that would allow her to get the needed medication with a

support us." This year she expects even more friends and family to join her and hopes to exceed last year's fundraising success.

In addition to offering hope and celebration, Jodi's Race is both an educational event and a fundraiser for COCA. Because there is no screening test for ovarian cancer, it's important for women to recognize the most

common symptoms bloating, pelvic or abdominal pain, difficulty eating or feeling full quickly and urinary urgency, or frequency. Any symptoms that continue for two weeks or more or recur frequently should be reported to a physician promptly. While the incidence of ovarian cancer increases after age 60, women can be diagnosed with the disease at any age. Funds

raised through Jodi's Race support COCA programs including support groups, individual counseling, financial assistance and navigation, an Ovarian Cancer Resource Guide, comfort kits, educational programs and much more.

minimal copay.

Once Sarah came to terms with her diagnosis, she decided that she wanted something good to come from her journey. She's made it her mission to make sure other women are aware of the symptoms of the disease, that they get regular health screenings, pay attention to their bodies and advocate for themselves when they feel something isn't quite right. She also wants to support COCA so that other women can receive the same resources that she has found so beneficial.

Sarah is eagerly looking forward to this year's Jodi's Race, which takes place on Saturday, June 11 at 7 a.m. in Denver's City Park. Recalling last year's Race, Sarah said, "I left the park that day feeling hopeful, inspired and completely uplifted. There was such a feeling of camaraderie among all the women and everyone who came out to in-office whitening

The Piano Pathway(s) to All Things Enlightening, Educational and Entertaining

You may have noticed Piano Pathways of Colorado storefront located in the Marketplace at Ken-Caryl shopping center in the Plains, but did you know that the store, its staff, and its programming are as rich and diverse as the music they teach?

Piano Pathways of Colorado (PPC), formerly known as Pianos n' Pianos, which opened its doors in 2006, offers a wide variety of services, including music instruction, fun and educational summer programming, and a recital space in addition to selling sheet music, pianos and other instruments, both new and on consignment. The organization is a 501(c)(3) non-profit dedicated to helping at-risk youth and disadvantaged individuals.

"Our goal is to create positive pathways for individuals at any age in all communities," said Angie Olsen, Executive Director of PPC, who also serves as the president of the organization's board of directors. "The music programs that we offer are through our in-house staff and our network of teachers in Colorado where, if qualified, PPC will pay for the teacher's lesson fee for an at risk, or disadvantaged individual."

In addition to piano lessons, both classical and jazz, PPC also provides guitar, ukulele, violin, viola, cello, banjo instruction as well as voice lessons. But that's not all! Their convenient location also features a small event hall that may be rented for musical recitals, classes, fundraisers, auctions and business meetings, with the space accommodating

row seating, and features two grand pianos, a microphone, kitchen, covered patio for outdoor seating and Zoom capabilities.

PPC is currently offering rich and diverse musical education programs, camps and classes to appeal to all ages.

"This summer we are offering various activities," said Angie. "A ukulele camp, arts and crafts, music talks, walk-in lessons, open stage/ mic and performances to watch. Since COVID we haven't been able to get these going, so this is our first attempt since the COVID shutdown. We are hoping for the best!"

The organization's consignment service, which allows for them to take pre-owned pianos to market and sell for the owner for profit sharing between both parties, helps to fund PPC's lesson and recital programs. They also allow for piano donations to support these programs and hope to expand their consignment services to include other instruments such as ukuleles, guitars, strings and world instruments.

"Our goal is to create positive pathways for individuals at any age in all communities," explains Angie. "We have a great selection of new and near new music books and sheet music, and we will be launching other exciting community outreach programs in the near future. Stay tuned for our Music Enrichment Program, where music students play for seniors, troubled teens, comparing the differences in genres and eras of music. Should be educational, interesting and fun!"

Next up, PPC is hosting a Jazz for Dad event on Father's Day, June 19 from 2-3:30 p.m. where you can treat dad to an afternoon of jazz and American music, played by instructor Greg Watkins. Tickets are currently on sale. 

Food. Family. Fundraising. How One Local Chef is Feeding Ukrainian Relief Efforts

Food is love. Food is life. Food is family. Food is hope. For Adam Samokishyn, Executive Chef at Mizuna, food is all these things and more, especially when it came to supporting humanitarian efforts to benefit the people of Ukraine. Adam, who grew up in Ken-Caryl, and is of Ukrainian decent, recently put his culinary talents to work, melding his passion and his heritage to support Ukraine relief efforts. The chef made up to 3,000 pierogi during the month of March, which included to-go dinners on March 16 and 25 and were a featured item on their recent tasting menu, with proceeds benefitting Jose Andrés World Central Kitchen.

Adam's grandparents were born and raised in Ukraine and immigrated to the United States, his father being a first-generation U.S. Ukrainian. The chef was raised on his Baba's cooking, which included rugula, borscht and scratchmade pierogi, the latter serving as the inspiration for his recent fundraising efforts.

"What was happening in Ukraine affected my dad pretty hard, and I thought, is there something we can do?," said Adam, who threw around several ideas with his colleagues, which included a sunflower cocktail, on how the restaurant could help generate funding to Ukrainian relief efforts. "My mom brought up the idea of pierogi on the menu, but then [we] also [thought about] doing a to-go program with proceeds going to Jose Andrés' World Central Kitchen."

With the idea crafted, so then followed his Baba's scratch-made pierogi, with Adam's mom, Marlene, a Ken-Caryl resident, joining him in Mizuna's kitchen.

"My mom, sister [Melissa], and our family friend [Suzie Lopata], were all helping volunteer in the kitchen," said Adam. "My dad was there as well watching and then he would cry he was so proud. We sold 1,000 – 1,200 pierogi in one day, not including the pierogi featured on the tasting menu," explained Adam, who estimated that he made 2,500 – 3,000 pierogi during the month of March, with \$5,355 worth of proceeds going to fund World Central Kitchen's efforts to feed Ukrainian refugees.

Adam, whose old stomping grounds included the Ranch House pool, fondly remembers his childhood growing up in Ken-Caryl Ranch, where neighbors would gather for 4th of July parties in their cul-de-sac on Pyramid Peak, playing roller blade street hockey with his friends and helping his mother in the kitchen, who he credits with helping to cultivate his love of cooking. His parents Marlene and Michael still reside in Ken-Caryl Ranch.

If you missed the fundraiser in March, but are craving authentic Ukrainian food and a desire to support the people of Ukraine, Adam says there's talk of another pop-up simmering, perhaps featuring his Baba's borscht. At present, he is reveling in the ripple effect the pierogi fundraiser had on the Denver



restaurant community.

"From us starting this, getting the word out that we were doing this, we saw this snowball effect with other restaurants around town helping out," said Adam, "It is really cool to see this snowball effect, from the idea of a cocktail bringing light to that." 


elected to the MA Board. The bad news is that Gerry was on the Open Space Committee and had to leave that post to join the Board. Twelve applicants applied for Gerry's spot on the OSC. Ten applicants were conservation minded and were gualified having lived in K/C for 20+ years and had volunteered time, money and passion for open space to be preserved. One applicant, Sally Cuffin, a professional Environmental Engineer, stood out as being the most qualified and an obvious choice to fill Gerry's spot and conservation leanings. Sally was not considered, nor were other conservation candidates.

One of the least qualified applicants, Anna Camp Martinez, was selected. Reasons for choosing her were: "no viewpoint," "young," "mother," "Sp. Ed. teacher," "objective to listen and learn.", "No viewpoint," except the fact that Anna has ties to the Trail Club, being the daughter of Paul Camp, one of the original organizers and current member of the TC. "Perception is reality."

ACM was chosen "to listen and learn." The question remains, who will she be listening to and who will she be learning from??? Often there has been only one dissenting vote on issues regarding new backcountry trails. Now there is only one collective mind on the OSC. How can there be diverse and robust discussions when all sides are not represented? Watch for unanimous votes in the future.

After announcing Anna's selection to the OSC, the Board President extended a message to those who were not chosen, "Don't go away, we care about you." Actions speak louder than words. If conservation voices were valued, they would have representation on the OSC. The rift in this community,


