Winter is Coming...

As we get closer to winter, I would like to acknowledge all the amazing residents that enhanced their properties this year. Our most requested project this summer was exterior painting. We also had a ton of driveways, fences, landscaping, new decks, patios and so much more spruced up this past year! All these investments on your property elevate your neighborhoods, and in turn, our property values continue to

thrive. With the crazy weather we had this year, I want to thank all of you for putting in the extra work to keep your yards and weeds at bay. This was my first year doing covenants and I have been so thankful at how quickly most of the residents have cured their violations. To me, this reflects the pride you have in where we live. Winterizing your home needs to be done prior to the first deep freeze of the season. Generally, this means by early to mid-October.

To keep your property safe through the winter, I have compiled a list below of some winterizing tips for your home.

- Change batteries and test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors.
- Have furnace inspected and serviced.
- · Clean out gutters to prevent ice dams that can cause roof leaks.
- Trim trees if needed to prevent tree limbs from falling on the roof during a heavy snowfall.
- Turn off water to outdoor spigots.
- Cover exterior spigot. Styrofoam-type insulating covers are available to prevent freezing and condensation.
- · Check all door and window weather stripping for damage.
- · Check and repair any worn or damaged weather-stripping caulk.
- Have lawn watering systems blown out to remove water from pipes.
- Store or protect outdoor lawn furniture.
- · Trim and prune all your garden and empty pots with dead plants.
- Cover your air conditioning units.

Get Your Permit for our Cut-Your-Own Christmas Tree Program

Cutting a Christmas tree in a national forest is a tradition for many families in our community. By cutting your own tree, you take an active part in managing your national forests! Once again, you can cut your own tree in our community's open space. The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Open Space Department, Open Space Committee and Board of Directors, in accordance with the Ken-Caryl Ranch Forest Stewardship Plan, is supporting our second season of the Cut-Your-Own Christmas Tree Program as a nice addition to the annual Christmas Tree harvest/sale in Ken-Caryl Ranch.

The program will provide the community with an option to register for a permit, limited to 75 permits, one per family, to hike in the open space and cut a Christmas tree. The cost of the permit is \$10, and all proceeds will go to offsetting Open Space Department expenses. The goal of the program is to take areas that are not as accessible to bulk forest operations and allow volunteers to cut their own trees in a designated area where regeneration of Douglas Fir trees is reaching such a height that it begins to act as a ladder fuel for wildfire, generally, over 6 feet tall, and affects forest health due to the density of the amount of trees. Other trees may be found at the sites, including Aspen and Ponderosa Pines; however, these trees are not part of the project for removal by residents. Douglas Fir trees are soft and small needled trees. Guidelines for the program include the following:

• You must have a valid permit to cut and/or remove Douglas Fir trees in designated areas from Ken-Caryl Ranch open space. Boundaries of the Christmas tree cutting sites will be marked with flagging, "Timber Harvest Boundary" and several trees may have "Do Not Cut" flagging attached. Please refer to the site map that is printed below this article.

- You must stay within the designated cutting areas (see maps).
- No topping of Douglas Fir trees cut to size once the full tree has been felled.
- Cut below lowest live limb leave stumps no higher than six inches.
- Hand saw only; no gas or electric saws allowed.
- Avoid damage to other trees.
- No vehicles, bikes, or horses are permitted. This program is for hikers only.
- Tree harvest dates; Nov. 19 Dec. 15.
 What a great way to support your

Open Space Department and receive a beautiful tree for the holidays! NOTE - While cutting and transporting your own Christmas tree from open space is a rewarding and great way to spend time with family, please be aware that it requires intense physical exertion including, walking long distances, hiking off trail, and standing on uneven ground and steep slopes. Be prepared for snowy and icy conditions and cold temperatures. For safety, residents are encouraged to dress in layers and to take plenty of breaks, as needed.

In preparation, Ken-Caryl Ranch is hosting our annual Christmas Tree Sale at the Dakota Lodge on Saturday, Dec. 2 from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m.! This year, we will return to a first come, first-served event format. The type of trees provided will be Douglas Firs, which are cut down from the foothills



open space and are more "natural" and will vary in size and shape. Rangers, with the help of volunteers, will display the trees next to the Dakota Lodge and barn as was done in the past. Additional trees will continue to be brought out throughout the sale. Refreshments will be provided by residents and realtors Brian Lee and Greg Milano with Colorado Home Realty (CHR)!

Donations (cash, check or credit card) are being accepted in exchange for the trees to offset expenses in the open space program. Limit one tree per family to ensure many families can enjoy this great tradition. For the annual tree sale, the Ken-Caryl Ranch Rangers harvest small diameter trees in the open space to improve wildlife habitat and overall forest health. The removal of the small trees reduces overcrowding and eliminates ladder fuels that can carry into a forest canopy.








Join Us for a Ken-Caryl Archaeology Presentation

Prior to the modern development of Ken-Caryl Ranch, which started in the 1970s, the landowners had the Denver Chapter of the Colorado Archaeological Society (CAS) do an archaeological survey of the land. Archaeology is the science that uncovers the physical objects, called artifacts, left behind by past peoples

and researches their meaning. As a result of these archaeological surveys and artifact finds from 1973-2020, 10 major archaeological sites have been excavated on Ken-Caryl Ranch land. FIREWISE LANDSCAPING

1. Home Ignition Zone

Keep leaves and needles off your roof and deck. Create a fuelfree area within 3-5 feet of your home's perimeter. From 5 feet to a minimum of 30 feet out, thin and space vegetation, remove dead leaves and needles, prune shrubs and tree limbs. Keep areas around decks, sheds, fences and swing sets clear of debris and vegetation.

2. Landscaping and Firewise Plants

To prevent fire spread, trim back branches that overhang structures and prune branches of large trees up to 6 to 10 feet from the ground. Remove plants containing resins, oils, and

3. Disaster Plan

Develop, discuss and practice an emergency action plan with everyone in your home. Include details for pets, large animals and livestock. Program cell phones with emergency numbers. Know two ways out of your neighborhood and have a predesignated meeting place. Have tools such as a shovel, rake, axe, handsaw, or chainsaw available, and maintain an emergency water source. Always leave if you feel unsafe – don't wait to be notified.

4. Emergency Responder Access

Identify your home and neighborhood with legible, clearly

5. Fire-Resistant Roof Construction

Use fire-rated shingles such as asphalt, metal, slate, clay tile or concrete products. A fire-resistant sub-roof adds protection. Box in eaves, but provide adequate ventilation to prevent condensation and mildew. Roof and attic vents should be screened to prevent ember entry.

6. Fire-Resistant Attachments

Any attachments to your home such as decks, porches, and fences must be fire-resistant. If not, your entire home is vulnerable to ignition.

waxes; make sure organic mulch is at least 5 feet from structures. Choose Firewise plants – find lists at www.firewise.org or from your local Cooperative Extension service. marked street names and numbers. Make your driveway at least 12 feet wide with a vertical clearance of 15 feet and a slope of less than 5 percent to provide access to emergency vehicles.

7. Fire-Resistant Walls and Windows

Embers can collect in small nooks and crannies and ignite combustible materials; radiant heat from flames can crack windows. Use fire-resistant siding such as brick, fiber-cement, plaster or stucco and tempered or double-paned glass windows to protect your home.







The original KC Open Space Management Plan states, "...open space represents an irreplaceable legacy that must be protected for future generations. Open space must be managed in a manner that preserves or restores ecosystems, protects and promotes natural biological diversity, and provides a balance..."

For the last 20 years, KC has steadily moved from its commitment to conservation and preservation of open space lands to an emphasis on recreation. After 20 years of budgeting funds for new backcountry trails, reroutes, connectors, etc. I'm pleased to see, for the first time, a "conserved" area is being considered for preservation and other important maintenance projects, like fencing, are being addressed.

Conservation and recreation make a rocky union. According to Sara Thomas, Environmental Historian at the UC's Center of the American West, "There's this belief, or hope, that you can



achieve a kind of mythological balance between preservation and access for recreation purposes, but that is not the case."

Recreation is not conservation or preservation. Recreation is an activity that man chooses to perform in his leisure time. Conservation and preservation are a choice made to co-exist by respecting the needs of nature. Human restraint is required. A philosophical value of preservation is the idea of restraint. When we designate an area for protection, we are asserting nature and natural processes have priority, and we accept limits on ourselves.

The idea for a "Special Management Area" of South Docmann isn't new. The minutes of the KC OSC on April 11, 2002 "pointed out that JeffCo Open Space had designated the land south, north, and east of Lockheed as sensitive habitat with restrictions on access. The MA land to the west (Wildcat) is biologically similar and would warrant the same protections."

I propose that South Docmann, or Wildcat, be designated as a preservation area in line with the original vision of the OSMP, "preserve... protect...restore..." I propose another name change to reflect our community's commitment to preservation and to symbolically honor John Fielder who aided this community in preserving the 14-Acre Meadow, and South Hogback. Join me in supporting a John Fielder Preservation Area.


