The Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District has two primary funding sources: property taxes and program/facility fees. Property taxes make up 60% of the

District's funding, and program/facility fees account for 30%. See chart printed with this article for the full revenue breakdown.

District staff aims to be good stewards of resident tax dollars and has strived to


implement multiple examples of good governance and continuous improvement.

- Financial continuous improvement examples include:
   11% reduction in Full-Time Equivalents (FTEs) from 2018 to 2023
- Unmodified audit four years in a row
- Successful completion of nearly \$1 million in capital projects in 2023
- Secured approximately \$350,000 in grants in 2023
- Transferred \$2.25 million to the Capital Reserve Fund at the beginning of 2024
- Increased interest income

The staff has also implemented multiple process advancements and efficiencies that contribute to an overall improvement in the District's governance. Examples include:


- Developed a 5-Year Strategic Plan
- Developed Landscape Design Guidelines that encourage water conservation, promote safety, lower maintenance, establish a brand, and enhance the landscape experience
- Substantial progress on urban forest improvements by removing dead, dying, or dangerous trees
- Implemented online registration and rental processes
- Streamlined numerous processes and software programs, particularly with finance, HR, and licensing
- Consolidated administrative functions at the Ranch House
   The District Board and staff have also focused on listening to resident feedback
   and implementing Community Planning Committee recommendations from the
   2021 Resident Survey, such as:
- New playground and other improvements at North Ranch Park
- New special events such as concerts, casino nights, and movie nights
- Increased programming like Ageless & Unstoppable, new fitness classes, and enrichment offerings
- Development of the Community Park Master Plan
- New shade structures at pools and parks
- Lined pickleball courts at Bradford Park

### Calling Rangers with Wildlife Concerns

When wildlife concerns or injuries arise, please call the Ken-Caryl Park Rangers for assistance.

Rangers will investigate, offer advice and guide residents towards a solution. If a response is needed, rangers will address as time allows up to 24 hours depending on the priority of the situation, time of day and availability of staff.

Throughout the year, the majority of calls we receive are regarding deer, and one of the main services the rangers provide to the community is removing dead deer from homeowner's properties, open space and roadways. This is an expedited service as Colorado Parks and Wildlife will most always have a longer response time than Ken-Caryl Ranch Park Rangers

For inquiries about sick or injured deer, staff operate under the same policy as Colorado Parks and Wildlife, which entails evaluating the animal. If a deer is injured, but can still feed and walk on its own, we let nature take its course. However, if the deer is unwell to the extent where it cannot feed or walk on its own, is listing to one side, or its head is lowered, then the rangers can respond to euthanize or direct the caller to contact Colorado Parks and Wildlife.

### **Large Mammals and Predators**

for removing dead deer.

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Park Rangers, under the direction of Colorado Parks and Wildlife, are always monitoring large wild animals and predators in the area jointly. Please contact either entity with questions or sightings.

For concerns about animals in yards, please read previous articles on how to safely haze wildlife or contact the rangers for more information. Ranger staff keep a log of these sightings and calls, as this can be especially helpful when monitoring certain animals such as black bears before hibernation.

A variety of snakes call Ken-Caryl home; the most notorious being the Prairie Rattlesnake. Colorado is home to 29 species of snakes found in a variety of habitats throughout the state. Ranger staff does not remove snakes, but we can provide information to contact private wildlife removal contractors for snakes around decks and homes.

### **Birds**

Due to avian flu and other diseases, rangers' response with birds, hawks, falcons, etc. is limited.

Rangers advise homeowners to contact Jefferson County Animal Control or Colorado Parks and Wildlife for assistance with sick or injured birds.

### **Small Animals and Nuisance Wildlife**

Ranger staff does not remove or address any small animals or nuisance wildlife. Jefferson County Animal Control will evaluate removal of animals, including racoons, squirrels, rabbits, etc. Jefferson County Animal Control does not handle nuisance wildlife animals such as mice, rats, voles, as these are left to homeowners or private contractors to remove or



### However You Roll, Please Obey The Rules of the Road

Summertime means more time outdoors as well as time in our cars and on our bikes for joy rides! So, however you choose to roll, residents are reminded that traffic laws apply to all, no matter your age! Here are a few helpful safety tips to keep bikers of all ages safe this summer as you hit the road in search of fun and adventure!

### Bike Defensively – Be Focused and Stay Alert!

Be focused and alert to the road and all traffic around you; anticipate what others may do, before they do it. This is defensive biking - the quicker you notice a potential conflict, the quicker you can act to avoid a potential crash:

- Ride with the flow, in the same direction as traffic.
- Obey street signs, signals, crosswalks and road markings, just like a car.
- Assume the other person doesn't see you; look ahead for hazards or situations to avoid that may cause you to fall, like toys, pebbles, potholes or grates.
- No texting, listening to music or using anything that distracts you by taking your eyes and ears or your mind off the road and traffic.
- By biking predictably, motorists get a sense of what you intend to do and can react to avoid a crash.
- Bike where you are expected to be seen, travel in the same direction as traffic and signal and look over your shoulder before changing lane position or
- Avoid or minimize sidewalk riding. Cars don't expect to see moving traffic on a sidewalk and don't look for you when backing out of a driveway or turning. Sidewalks sometimes end unexpectedly, forcing the bicyclist into a road when a car isn't expecting to look for a bicyclist.
- Watch for pedestrians.
- Pass pedestrians with care by first announcing "on your left" or "passing on your left" or use a bell.
- Ride in the same direction as traffic. This way, if the sidewalk ends, you are already riding with the flow of traffic. If crossing a street, motorists will look left, right, left for traffic. When you are to the driver's left, the driver is more
- Slow and look for traffic (left-right-left and behind) when crossing a street from a sidewalk; be prepared to stop and follow the pedestrian signals.
- Slow down and look for cars backing out of driveways or turning. Enjoy the ride!





# Bi-Weekly Recycling and Tote Delivery FAQs

**Question:** Why did Ken-Cary Ranch transition to a bi-weekly (every other week) recycling collection schedule?

**A:** The MA Board voted at its October 2023 meeting to switch to bi-weekly recycling. Three out of the five board members voted to transition to a bi-weekly recycling schedule for an approximate savings of \$89k/year.

**Question:** When did bi-weekly recycling collection services go into effect? **A:** May 1, 2024

**Question:** What are the requirements for recycling collection services? **A:** All residents must have an approved 64- or 96-gallon recycling tote from Waste Connections. However, residents may use older totes or those from other trash providers **SO LONG AS** they are in the approved 64- or 96-gallon sizes. Residents who use a tote from another provider or purchased via a retailer, such as at Home Depot or Lowes, **MUST ALSO** cover any existing logos with Waste Connections logo stickers, or apply stickers to unlabeled totes. Stickers are available for FREE pick-up at the Ranch House or the Community Center during normal business hours.

Question: Do I need an approved tote for my trash?

**A:** No. New tote requirements apply only to recycling collection services. Residents may continue to use their current trash totes, cans, bins, or bags without any disruption to trash collection services. As a reminder, residents can have up to 6 trash cans/bins/bags, AND up to 6 cans/bins/bags or bundles of yard debris.

**Question:** Does the new bi-weekly recycling contract with Waste Connections also include bi-weekly trash collection services?

**A:** Trash and recycling will be collected for residents on the same day of the week; however, trash will be collected every week and recycling will be collected every other week.

**Question:** Is there a way to get a copy of my personal trash collection and biweekly recycling schedule?

**A:** Yes. You can enter your address via Waste Connections' website and have a personalized trash and recycling schedule populated for you! To get a copy of your personalized trash/recycling collections pick-up schedule, visit: https://www.wasteconnections.com/pickup-schedule/

**Question:** I ordered my recycling totes prior to the March 15 online ordering deadline. When can I expect to get my new tote?

**A:** Tote deliveries for online orders have been fulfilled. If you haven't received your tote, or need to place an order, please contact Waste Connections directly.

**Question:** Once Waste Connections has their new tote inventory in and they begin scheduling new tote deliveries, what can I expect in terms of swapping out my totes?

**A:** Waste Connections will either 1.) contact residents directly regarding new tote deliveries/swap outs, or 2.) residents who may have missed a swap out can still place their old totes, cans, bins, etc., out the day of their trash collection services and label them, "Please take as trash."

**Question:** What do I do with my old totes/cans/bins once I receive my new tote? Am I responsible for the disposal of my old totes?

**A:** No. Residents are asked to place their old cans, bins, totes etc., out the day of their trash collection services and label them, "Please take as trash."

**Question:** I put out my old tote to be picked up as trash and labeled it correctly, but Waste Connections didn't collect it. What can I do?

**A:** Waste Connections has assured us that, while it may take time, they are committed to collecting all old bins from residents during their scheduled trash collection days. Please continue to put out your old totes or cans for disposal until they are collected. To ensure collection, please clearly label the receptacles to be disposed of as "Please take as trash."

**Question:** I ordered my recycling tote after the March 15 deadline. Will my recycling still be collected?

A: Waste Connections cannot guarantee that recycling in unapproved containers will continue to be collected once recycling tote orders placed prior to the March 15 deadline are fulfilled. Residents who placed online orders for their new recycling bins may experience a disruption in their collection services. Residents will need to order a tote from Waste Connections to ensure their recycling is collected. Residents who need a tote ASAP, may also purchase a tote in either the approved 64- or 96-gallon sizes from a third-party provider, retailer or online retailer. However, please note that all totes must be labeled with Waste Connections logo stickers, available for FREE pick-up at the Ranch House or the Community Center during normal business hours.

**Question:** I ordered new trash totes. When can I expect to receive them? **A:** Waste Connections is prioritizing the fulfillment of recycling tote orders for residents as part of the new recycling tote requirements per the Master Associations contract with Waste Connections. Please stay tuned to all of Ken-Caryl's communications channels, including our e-Newsletter (Ken-Caryl Ranch e-News), Life at Ken-Caryl newspaper, our website at www.ken-carylranch. org and our Facebook page @ken-carylranch for the latest updates and information. Please note, the Master Association is able to push out immediate updates via our website and on social media.

**Question:** What if my current recycling bin is overflowing? What options do I have between bi-weekly collection services?



**A:** Residents do have the option of getting an additional recycling bin for \$6/ month, billed directly by Waste Connections. If you are interested in ordering an additional tote, you may do so by contacting Waste Connection directly. **See below regarding ways to connect with Waste Connections.** 

**Question:** I haven't received my new totes and/or need to order new trash and recycling totes. How can I place an order?

**A:** Please note that the Master Association is no longer taking online trash and recycling tote orders. Residents who need to order a tote may contact Waste Connections in any of these ways:

- 3. Contact Waste Connections by phone at 303-288-2100. For the fastest response time, we highly recommend using email or the website.

**Question:** Waste Connections didn't pick up my trash and/or recycling during a collections week. What can I do?

### Colonel Tom Coakley Delivers Heartfelt Speech at Ken-Caryl's Memorial Day Event

Residents came out to honor fallen servicemen and women who bravely fought for our country during the Memorial Day Event at the Veterans Monument in the Plains on May 27.

Resident, MD Board Vice President and U.S. Special Forces combat veteran Jim Conzelman served as the event's emcee, where he thanked those currently serving in the armed forces, while acknowledging and paying tribute to those who paid the ultimate price for the cause of freedom, stating that he never forgot the "...sisters, brothers, fathers and mothers answering the call to serve... and sometimes never coming home."

Jim introduced the event's keynote speaker, Retired Air Force Colonel and Ken-Caryl resident, Tom Coakley. Tom's extensive experience in the military includes serving as Joint Staff member at the Pentagon, as the Dean of Students at the Defense Language Institute in California and as the Deputy Department Head and Professor for the U.S. Air Force Academy. He also commanded a training group, intelligence studies, cybersecurity and engineering technology in Texas. Prior to his retirement in 2022, Colonel Coakley's final military assignment was

as Director of the Joint Overhead Persistent Infrared Center, U.S. Space Command, National Geospatial Intelligence Agency in Denver, where he directed a \$79 billion global sensor operation with 210 assigned personnel. Following his retirement, Tom serves as the Dean of Communications, Humanities, Art, and Design at Arapahoe Community College.

Colonel Coakley addressed a crowd of 100 people to honor the patriotism and sacrifice of the warriors who fight for freedom.

"Service of any kind comes with sacrifice. I spent more than three years away from my family while I was on active duty, and I am proud to be called a veteran," said Colonel Coakley. "But Memorial Day is very different. If it's a celebration, it's a very complicated one. It's a day to remember the kind of sacrifice no service member ever wants their comrades to make. It's

inevitable that on Memorial Day, I'll cry, and perhaps you do, too. We remember the incredible men and women who left us too early, who made the sacrifice we did not want them to make. We think of their families, their loved ones and their profound grief. I am now too old to push the tears away. I cry because I can."

According to Colonel Coakley, he summoned the voices of friends, loved ones, and heroes who no longer speak in preparation of addressing the crowd at the Memorial Day event, stating, "For me, Memorial Day is about remembering the words of my comrades and imagining, as best as I can, what their lives left unsaid."

Colonel Coakley reflected fondly on former cadet, Freshman Cadet Roslyn "Roz" Schulte, who he described as bright, ambitious and charismatic, and who made an impression on him during his first day as an instructor for the Air Force Academy. He went on to describe her many accomplishments that included becoming the captain of the Academy's women's lacrosse team and an intern for Colorado's Senator Wayne Allard. Later, she would go on to earn one of the nation's highest honors for intelligence officers.

On May 20, 2009, Roslyn Littman Schulte was killed in Afghanistan while driving with retired Army Lieutenant Colonel Sean Pine when their vehicle was struck by an improvised explosive device as they were driving back to base. Both were killed.


Colonel Coakley acknowledged their ultimate sacrifice, and that of their families, concluding his speech by stating that Roz, "...is a memory to us like so many other fallen service members. Roz, and so many, have given what they could in the name of American democracy and freedom. For those here who have lost a loved one or who support someone in grief, we remember you, too. We know something of your grief. When I cry today, I will remember you, too."

Colonel Coakley concluded his speech by thanking all those in attendance. Thank you to Colonel Tom Coakley, Jim Conzelman, and to all residents, veterans and friends who attended this year's event to pay tribute to our nation's fallen heroes.



### Brothers Liam and Conor Young Both Earn the Prestigious Rank of Eagle Scout

Residents, siblings and Scouts Liam and Conor Young, along with their fellow Troop 686 members and volunteers, recently completed community service projects to earn the prestigious, and final, rank of Eagle Scout.

The rank of Eagle Scout is the most difficult to achieve and requires a scout to solely research, guide and manage a project that positively impacts their community. The 14-year-olds, who just completed the 8th grade at the STEM School Highlands Ranch, completed separate community impact projects to earn this prestigious rank.

Liam earned the rank of Eagle Scout for his work in removing invasive species and to plant native plants at Crown Hill Park in Lakewood. As part of this project, Liam had to research native plants, then fundraise, purchase all the supplies needed to complete his project and then organize and lead volunteers to complete the work. After introducing the plants, Liam then had to water the plants every weekend, hauling water jugs in a wagon to the project site.

"My project goals were to clear the area of invasive plants, and plant native plants to encourage pollinator insects, and to give the plants the best chance at coming back after this winter by getting their roots in deep," said Liam.

Liam is very appreciative of his sponsor and to his Ken-Caryl neighbors for their support as he worked to complete his project.

"I am very grateful to the Garlic Knot for sponsoring a fundraising night and donating money to my project, to all [the Ken-Caryl residents] in my neighborhood who hired me to mow their lawn and do yard work to earn money for my project, to everyone who bought cookies and lemonade, and to all who donated," said Liam. "In all, I raised \$1,000 for my project. I am also grateful to all the people in my troop and in this neighborhood who volunteered their time to help."

Liam earned the rank of Eagle Scout on Feb. 28, and had his court of honor on May 4. He is proud of his recent accomplishment.

"When I earned the Eagle rank it felt like a great accomplishment and I thought about my journey to get to where I was," said Liam. "This rank stands for the hard work, discipline, and dedication that the scouts have put forth into their project and in the years leading up to it. Earning the Eagle Scout Rank has many requirements. In addition to my Eagle Scout Service Project, I served in three leadership roles, earned 36 merit badges, completed 34 nights of camping, 92 miles of hiking, 120+ service hours, and demonstrated too many rank advancement skills to count since first becoming a scout in 2021."

According to Liam, rank requirements also include a final Board of Review, where he had to obtain five letters of recommendation, draft a statement of purpose, create detailed reports of his Eagle Scout Service project, write scouting and personal resumes and then be interviewed by the Scouting Alpine District Board to review his qualifications.

"Through it all, I learned so much from great the role models in my troop - scoutmasters, parent volunteers

and other scouts," said Liam.
"Some people know what the rank means; others do not, but it does not matter to me since I know the value of the rank. I'll be able to carry the skills and grit I have learned through this process forward with me into my future endeavors. As a leader in my scout troop, this rank means I set a good example for younger scouts and help train them to be exceptional leaders."

In addition to earning the rank of Eagle Scout, Liam also received a silver palm for earning fifteen more than the required 21 merit badges; 17 of which are Eagle required.

Brother and fellow scout, Conor Young also earned the rank of Eagle Scout for his work in leading the design and construction of five 3-bay compost bins and two 150-foot paths at Sprout City Farms, a non-profit urban farm growing food for food banks, Head Start programs and the elderly. As part of this project, Conor also worked to repair a rotting bench at the farm.

"For many of my service hours, I spent time serving food to the poor, packing food boxes with Food Bank of the Rockies, packing food bags with Feed My Starving Children, serving food at the Denver Rescue Mission, collecting food with our troop's annual food drive, and in helping with fall clean-up at Sprout City Farms," said Conor. "I knew that I wanted to do something to help in this

area, and Sprout City Farms had lots of ideas. They had a big compost pile that was hard for them to maintain, so they asked for a compost bin. I researched online and found plans for a 3-bay compost bin and offered to make five of them to manage all their compost. I also built two 150-foot paths to make it easier for their volunteers to use wheelbarrows to carry things throughout the property, and replaced wood on a rotting bench with composite material."

According to Conor, prep work for his project was extensive. His team spent several days building parts at his house, prior to the two day of required weekend assembly - in the snow - and an additional two days of path building. Like his brother, Conor is also

very appreciative of the support from the Ken-Caryl community.

Monarchs, Milkweed and Mayhem

...In the short term, threats consist of predators, pesticides, and disease, such as viral and bacterial infections, as well as parasites. In the long term, the threat is loss of habitat, especially in migratory corridors, due to development, deforestation, and climate change. There are three known native milkweed circles in Ken-Caryl Valley: North Ranch, Brannon Gearhart Park and along South Valley Rd.

We are fortunate to have the Chatfield Butterfly Pavilion, a branch of Denver Botanic Gardens here in our Ken-Carvl community. This seasonal habitat is home to hundreds of native butterflies, including monarchs. The butterfly garden on Deer Creek Canyon Rd. opens on May 25 at 9 a.m. Stop by for a visit to enjoy a whimsical atmosphere and to learn about milkweed and other plants to grow in order to help monarch butterflies and other pollinators. ### **Dear Editor**

Every year, I am saddened by the Colorado Parks and Wildlife's arbitrary decisions. There seems to be no consistent policy for what action to take after a human and wildlife interaction.

Recently in Colorado Springs, a mother bear protecting her cubs was euthanized for swatting at a hiker who fell and scraped his arm, then continued his hike. He was not in need of medical treatment and didn't call CPW until later, after he finished his hike. The mother bear's three cubs are now orphaned. Two of them were relocated to Routt County and the third left to survive on its own. This mother bear was behaving naturally, protecting her cub in a surprise encounter. If CPW had not been contacted, the mother bear and her three cubs would still be a family unit.

In another recent conflict in Estes Park, an elk cow, behaving naturally protecting her calf, charged a young girl and stomped her. The 8-year-old was hospitalized and released the same day. The elk cow was not euthanized, but hazed. The calf was removed to a wildlife lab for care, so the mother would not feel the need to be aggressive.

One was a simple surprise encounter and yet the mother bear lost her life, and a family was separated. One was a more serious conflict, gladly, the elk cow was allowed to live.

All mothers have the right to protect their young with impunity.

Why are CPW rules so different for mother bears and mother elk?




