### **Community Park Master Plan**

Hopefully you have seen announcements over the last few months about the Master Planning process for Community Park, which is located across the street from Shaffer Elementary in the Plains. The Metropolitan District led an extensive community engagement process, and we are thrilled to announce that the Board approved a conceptual Master Plan for the park.

You might be asking why we need a Master Plan for Community Park. Much of the initial consideration for the Master Plan came out of the 2017 and 2021 Community Surveys. Residents expressed a strong desire for a bathroom at the park, new special event

programs, gathering venues, playground upgrades, pickleball courts, a bike park and upgraded playing fields.

The park was developed 30 years ago, and given the age of the park and the changing desires of the community, there is a necessity for improved safety, updated facilities and increased activity. Rather than simply addressing these issues, the Metropolitan District took a more global approach to the plan to gauge how to serve the next generation of users and not just our own uses today.

Through three community meetings and two online surveys, we heard from several hundred residents. There was a strong desire for field improvements, safety, walkability, water conservation, community gathering spaces, safer parking and access options, and increased activity opportunities such as pickleball and a youth bike park. Thank you to everyone who participated in this important process!

The Master Plan incorporates the feedback from the 2017 and 2021 Community Surveys as well as feedback from the community meetings and recent online surveys. The plan includes a promenade area for community gatherings, restroom, picnic pavilions, improved baseball and multi-purpose fields, pickleball courts, an additional parking lot, a youth bike park, expanded walking paths, demonstration gardens and outdoor learning areas. The current playground at Community Park was upgraded in 2014 so it will remain for several more years. However, the Master Plan includes an expansion of the playground that may include natural play areas and more inclusive play opportunities.

While the Metropolitan District Board did approve the conceptual plans, funding has not yet been allocated for the project. The beauty of this Master Plan is it can be done over several years and in multiple phases. The Board will be discussing the plans and funding over the next couple of years and determining next steps. ### **Keeping Things Neat and Tidy**

Hello, Ken-Caryl!

I hope this column finds you well. I have deemed that "tidy" is the word of the month. It is that time of year that the weeds are in full bloom, so please stay ahead of your weeds by plucking them from your yard and garden beds or by spraying them. There are many organic formulas or products on the market if you are not comfortable using a chemical-based weed killer.

All the old leaves, pine needles, pinecones and old mulch from the winter have probably been collecting under your shrubs and need to be picked up. Not only for aesthetics, but for the safety of your home,

as these can serve as fuel for wildfire. I love seeing many residents out and about, enjoying the warmer weather and keeping their properties beautiful by mowing, weeding, planting and touching up paint!

Now that the kids are jumping feet first into summer vacation – or the pool – just a few friendly reminders of what you can do to stay in compliance. Play and sports equipment such as portable basketball hoops, sports nets, toys and bikes - just to name a few - must be stored properly when not in use. Portable basketball hoops must be stored at least halfway up the driveway in an upright position. Nets and toys should be stored out of public view.

The most frequent violation we observe during the summer months is stored items left out in public view. We commonly see trash bins, lawn mowers, ladders, pallets and wheelbarrows that are stored outside. So please be courteous and store these items when not in use.

North American Development Group to begin contracted earthwork construction for the new housing development in the Ken-Caryl Ranch Plains

### Digging in the Dirt

North American Development Group (NADG) purchased land for a new home development in the Ken-Caryl Ranch Plains in 2020. A total of approximately 700 units (single-family, townhomes and multi-family) are planned for development over three parcels of land, including Parcels A and C, located east of C-470 and north of Ken Caryl Ave., and Parcel B, located at the southwest corner of Ken Caryl Ave. and Chatfield Ave. NADG hired earthworks contractor Bemas Construction to begin soil work in Parcels A and B in the coming weeks. All work will be done outside of Jefferson County's quiet hours. Work will typically take place between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5:30 p.m., and Bemas will begin moving soil from Parcel B to Parcel A with an estimated start date of mid-June.

To provide an idea of the project's scope, more than half a million yards of dirt will be moved from the Parcel B development across from King Soopers to the Parcel A and C developments between the RTD bus station and Foothills Golf Course in preparation for the new housing development. A total of 2.5 million yards of dirt will be moved upon completion of this project. The reason behind the massive dirt removal is to bring Parcel B down to grade (street level) and to fill in

the "bowl" on Parcel A for accessibility, drainage and street-scaping. Bemas will be using Ken Caryl Avenue as a primary means to transport the dirt beginning in mid-June, and will be working with traffic engineers to establish a movement pattern that accommodates residents during this 8-10-month process. Closures along Ken Caryl are not anticipated, but residents should be aware that outgoing traffic from Safeway along the Alkire intersection ONLY will not be permitted during this time.

The trail to the north of Sunset Ridge that connects the Plains to the Safeway complex will not be disturbed in the initial phases of construction. Any changes or reroutes that may occur in later phases will be communicated to residents in advance to ensure public safety. It is Bemas' intention to minimize the duration of any possible closures.

Part of the earthworks project will involve using water to cure and temper soil, which will also aid in dust suppression during construction. Tracking pads, rock retainers and recycled asphalt will be placed around the job site to minimize dirt and mud on streets. Bemas is also contracted to perform periodic street sweeping to help keep our community clear of dust and dirt, and work will be suspended in windy or unsafe conditions.

During construction, Bemas will be properly maintaining safety barriers throughout the project's duration. We ask that residents respect the borders of designated construction areas during this time to ensure public safety.

The Master Association and the Metropolitan District are in continued communication with Bemas, and any updates or pertinent information will be communicated across Ken-Caryl's established communications channels as it becomes available.

# **Ken-Caryl Volunteer Patrol**

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Rangers have recently welcomed six new residents into the KCR Volunteer Patroller Program! They will be volunteering their time, along with 26 other residents in the program, to patrol the trail system and educate users on the rules of the open space. Volunteer Patrollers (VPs) attend a 2.5-hour training that also includes contact scenarios. VPs are trained in many aspects, but the major one obviously is making professional contact. This includes an introduction/gaining the users



attention, reason for stopping the user, educating on subject matter or any rule violation and a positive closing. Training scenarios help to review many types of contacts that VPs may encounter in the field. VPs, along with park rangers, must verify residency by either viewing a Ken-Caryl Ranch open space ID bracelet (Ken-Caryl or Ken-Caryl/Willow Springs Trail crew) on a person or bike, or stopping the user to verify residency. It may be between a quarter second to a few seconds to try and view a bracelet for hiker/runner/biker. If the bracelet is not viewed on the front of a bike or on a person, like a backpack/wrist/dog leash, VPs must stop the trail user to verify residency by asking them for an address or a family name to check records. VPs try their best to approach trail users in a positive manner, and the job is difficult as it takes many hours of practicing contacts to become proficient. VPs are always trying to offer education to properly identify residents. They are also looking for trespassers and will direct them to leave the private trails, accordingly. This is different from being a volunteer patroller/host at a public open space/park agency, as one is not stopping or directly contacting every user on the trails or parks.

#### **KCR Members Can do Their Part**

All residents are reminded to securely attach your trail bracelets to the front of your person or bike. Please **do not** place the bracelet in your pocket, attach it to backside of backpack or hat, or under your bike seat, in the wheel hub, neck/ stem of your bike, etc. **Place the bracelet on your wrist, front of pack, dog leash or handlebars!** With limited time to verify a bracelet when oncoming trail users appear, having it displayed correctly is the best way for a VP or ranger to recognize an authorized user. After viewing the bracelet, VPs can offer a simple verbal thank you, wave or thumbs up sign.

Another crucial part is that VPs and park rangers must also <u>view</u> the bracelet text, symbol or serial number to ensure it is an approved bracelet and not someone with just the same color bracelet trying to commit fraud. In addition, if a bracelet is not observed, VPs <u>will stop</u> the trail user to confirm residency.

Park rangers, identified by a patrol uniform with badge and duty belt, and VPs, who wear a blue vest, ID with a black patch and orange bike placard, are authorized to contact users on the trail system. Trail users do not have to answer questions from non-VPs/rangers, or other trail users if approached, unless they feel comfortable doing so. However, these individuals are not authorized or trained by the open space department to perform contacts.

Please remember, the VPs are **donating their free time** and are not paid.

They are providing education on all rules of the open space, attempting to keep out trespassers and want to do their part to assist the community in keeping Ken-Caryl Ranch a great place to live.

### Damage to Natural Resources in the Open Space

I am writing to inform residents of a trend that the rangers have observed over the last few years of damage taking place in our open space by young Ken-Caryl residents. Rangers normally view children hiking, biking and playing in the open space. The drainages in the open space can be attractive to children, as they offer the opportunity for imaginary play in the area. Unfortunately, when playing or socializing in the drainages, damage often results from digging, damming the water flow, dragging boards to build forts and hammering boards into trees. This is not proper use of open space and only damages our community's natural resources. Additionally, the material left can become lodged in culverts if a strong stream flow occurs from a weather event. Digging into stream banks can, and will, make the ground unstable and may eventually cause a collapse onto a child!


Park Rangers will issue a contact notice to offending individuals in accordance with Open Space & Parks Rule #7: "Removing, destroying, mutilating, defacing, damaging, or disturbing any vegetation, wildlife, natural feature, building, structure, facility or sign is prohibited."

Rangers encourage young residents to get outside and enjoy the open space, but would like that to happen responsibly. Parents, please discuss this matter with your children as they may not understand the rules, and this would be a great benefit to the community!

Rangers are aware of activity in particular areas in the drainages, specifically in Brannon Gearhart Park. Routine patrols occur, but rangers cannot be everywhere at once and rely on reports from residents. If you see this activity, or an area that has been altered, please call or email the rangers to report it. 












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# Community Composting Survey Now Open!

The Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association is currently hosting a community survey to gather resident feedback on bringing residential composting collection services to Ken-Caryl Ranch.

Compost Colorado, an established Denver-area commercial composting facility and registered Public Benefit company, is open to expanding its current boundaries to include Ken-Caryl and outsourcing our community's composting needs to a company with an industrial facility would make it easy for residents to start composting. From a handful of members in 2018, Compost Colorado has grown in five years to include over 2,000 residential members and 150 commercial partners.

If at least 200 residents are interested in participating in feebased curbside composting, then Compost Colorado will launch a pilot program for our neighborhood. While our HOA would act as a marketing conduit, helping to facilitate the sign-up process, the service would be homeowner-paid, meaning community composters would pay for the service directly through Compost Colorado's website. Since pricing is based on a sliding scale, the monthly cost of curbside composting could range from \$12 to \$17 per month, depending on how many residents sign up.


Once registered, community composters would receive a 5-gallon bucket to fill with food scraps and yard waste throughout the week. Similar to our trash and recycle service, participants would leave their bucket on their curb by 7 a.m. on pick-up day. All participants would receive compost dividends in the spring.



### Memorial Day Celebration in Ken-Caryl Ranch

Residents came out to honor fallen servicemen and women who bravely fought for our country during the Memorial Day Celebration at the Veterans Monument in the Plains on May 29.

Resident, MD Board Secretary and U.S. Special Forces combat veteran Jim Conzelman addressed a crowd of 125 people to honor the patriotism and sacrifice of the warriors who paid the ultimate price for the cause of freedom, stating, "Freedom is that scarlet thread of common ideology that ignited and sustains our USA movement. Scarlet because of the bloody price to establish and defend it. Freedom is never free because it has formidable and enduring foes."

During his service as active military, Jim was deployed as a

Naval Flight Officer to Asia and the Middle East as part of a patrol aviation squadron assigned to keep commercial shipping lanes open and enforce sanctions from a P-3 Orion prop plane before being assigned to teach leadership and ethics at the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland.

"We call the actions of one who sacrifices for another in battle 'heroic;' these heroes more often refer to their own actions as honor and duty, stemming from a more humble acknowledgement of interdependence, driven by the desire to protect the very soldiers, sailors, marines and airmen with whom they serve," remarked Jim.

Jim also took a moment to acknowledge the many veterans who lost their lives after combat from physical and psychological wounds.

Jim concluded his speech by saying, "Despite our ongoing divisive politics and beliefs, may we be

united in our fight for freedom, and carry on the same selfless concern and sacrifice for our neighbors that inspired so many of the warriors we honor today."




