This Job Description outlines the basic requirements, duties, and general responsibilities of the position of the Technician I - Turf. Unless modified by a written Employment Agreement, this position is "at-will," which means the Ken-Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District ("District") may terminate the employment relationship at any time and for no reason, subject only to the requirements of federal and state law. Similarly, the employee may terminate the employment relationship without notice at any time for no reason.

The headings in this job description are for reference only and shall not affect its interpretation. Unless expressly defined in this job description, all terms have the same meaning as defined in the Employee Handbook.

**Job Summary:**

Under the supervision of the Parks Supervisor, Technician I – Turf is responsible for the daily mowing and maintenance of the irrigated turf areas within the District's parks system.

**Essential Functions:**

The following duties are an overview of the primary duties and responsibilities of the Technician II – Turf and should not be considered an all-inclusive list.

- A. Mow, aerate, and assist in fertilization of parks, greenbelts and baseball/soccer fields; assist in identifying problems observed in the parks so that appropriate personnel can address them (i.e. wet or dry grass areas, tree damage, playground or greenbelt light damage, etc.)
- B. Know how to safely operate equipment and power tools including, but not limited to, riding mowers, walk-behind mowers, trimmers, edgers, blowers, sod cutter, front-end loader, backhoe, dump truck, skid-steer, snow removal equipment, tree chipper, and stump grinder.
- C. Assist in various landscape maintenance projects (i.e. raking, trash removal, fence and lighting repair, snow removal, etc.)
- D. Lead, monitor, and train assigned staff in daily operations, the proper and safe handling of tools, and the operation of equipment used in turf maintenance.
- E. Direct inquiries from the public to appropriate supervisory staff; establish and maintain positive working relationships with supervisors and co-workers.
- F. Consistently promote a positive, professional image of the District and provide excellent customer service at all times.

**Authority Exercised:**

This position may lead seasonal staff.

**Required Experience:**

- 1. High School Diploma.

**Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:**

- 1. Ability to work a 40 hour per week schedule that could include some evenings, early mornings and weekends as conditions or programming schedules might dictate.
- 2. Ability to read, write, speak, and understand the English language at a level adequate to perform the job.
- 3. Must have the ability to be flexible and be able to adapt to changing daily schedules based on timelines

and equipment/vehicle repair needs.

4. Working in a variety of locations and sometimes in challenging weather conditions.

**Special Requirements:**

1. Possess and maintain a valid Colorado Driver's License and be insurable by the District's insurance carrier by maintaining an acceptable driving record.

**Work and Physical Requirements:**

This position requires work in a variety of locations and conditions, including but not limited to the Parks Department Maintenance Facility, other Recreational facilities, and outside areas within the District's park system. Time in the off-season is spent inside to design landscape areas.

*Working Environment*

1. Moderate physical activity will be required frequently.
2. Work will be required outdoors in all weather conditions.
3. Work may be required under hazardous and adverse conditions, including, but not limited to, slippery and uneven surfaces and proximity to moving mechanical equipment.
4. Use of sensory activities, such as talking, seeing, hearing, smelling, feeling (identifying objects by touch), depth perception and color vision will be required frequently.

*Physical Requirements*

1. Have ability to lift, move and carry objects in excess of fifty (50) pounds frequently.
2. Have ability to stand, walk, sit, kneel, stoop, bend, lift, squat, push, pull, crawl, jump, slide, climb, pinch, grip, reach overhead, reach away from body, and perform repetitive motions.
3. Be able to work evenings, holidays, and weekends as needed.
