

Bond Projects Open House Feb. 10

With the community's approval of \$7.9 million in tax-exempt bonds last May, planning has begun for facility and infrastructure improvements for Ken-Caryl Ranch. The Metropolitan District Board has entered into agreements with an Owner's Representative (Vanir Construction Management), a building architect (Sink Combs Dethlefs) and a landscape design architect (Atkinson Design). A Construction Manager/General Contractor will be hired in February.

There will be an open house for all

residents to share their thoughts/desires with the design team on Tuesday, Feb. 10 from 4:30-7:30 p.m. at the Ranch House. This is a come-and-go style of meeting, so you can stop by any time during the three-hour time window. Free child care will be available. After the open house, information will be posted online for comment. Please see the Bond & Improvement Projects article on Page 3 for more information. Clearly bond projects will be an important/exciting part of 2015 on Ken-Caryl Ranch. However, there are other projects scheduled for this year that are funded through your Master Association dues.

Work is underway just east of the Community Center to improve a reach of Massey Draw before it goes through the hogback. The rail fence along the north side of the greenbelt that runs between Continental Divide Road and Chatfield is scheduled for replacement. Phase five of a 10-year plan to replace the asphalt paths in the Valley with concrete will be completed.

In addition, funding from the Master Association Reserve account will be combined with bond funds to replace playgrounds. The specific playgrounds have not been identified at this time, so stay tuned for more information.

Please mark your calendar and plan to attend the bond project open house at the Ranch House on Feb. 10. Staff is working with Vanir (our Owner's Representative) and Sink Combs Dethlefs (the architects) and many dedicated volunteers to create the most effective plan to make improvements with the bond money. In addition we really need resident input in order to create the best plan.

bond project community open house on Tuesday, Feb. 10 from 4:30-7:30 p.m. at the Ranch House. This will be the first opportunity for all residents to meet the design team and provide input on the priorities developed for the Ranch House, Community Center and Dakota Lodge.

Architects from Sink Combs Dethlefs and representatives from Vanir Construction Management will be at the open house to facilitate the gathering of resident comments. In addition, residents from bond project focus groups and KCR staff will be in attendance to assist in this important information-gathering session. The Metropolitan District will provide childcare services.

The architects will summarize input gathered at this session and will post a forum summary on the bond project page located on our website, www.ken-carylranch.org, under the Administration tab. Residents unable to attend can contribute their thoughts via the bond project email address: bondprojects@kcranch.org. Resident input will contribute toward the development of specific design concepts for the Ranch House, Community Center and Dakota Lodge. A second community forum in February will share those concepts with residents.

Get Muddy; Stay on the Trail!

This time of the year can be very frustrating for trail users. The warm weather we are having is melting the accumulated snow and is causing the ground to thaw out and create soft and damp trail surface conditions. Although they might be dry at the trailhead, as you ascend the hillsides, most trails are still muddy and soft due to weather conditions varying in higher elevation and trails that are south facing. This is not only true at this time of the year but also come early spring when we have an increase in snow-melt runoff.

The trail surface of the ground is still frozen and water from the melting snow isn't able to be absorbed or to drain. This makes the trails soft, muddy and sloppy.

Become familiar with the trail system and pay attention to the trails and trail segments that dry out first. Service roads like the Manor House Trail, Hogback Trail and Cathy Johnson Trail can absorb more damage and usually dry out faster than single-track trails.

Avoid higher elevation trails like Upper Bradford (over Tin Cup) and trails in softer soils like the Lyons Hogback Trail. Avoid high snow-melt times. Trails are generally more solid in the early morning hours. Trails tend to be sloppier in the afternoon. The key to trail conservation in the fall and spring is to stay on the trail.

Winter Trail Use Tips:

 If you must go out on the trail, stay on the trail surface at all times.

- In winter, ride or hike early in the morning when trails are frozen and hard.
- If you encounter stretches of mud, ride or walk through them. Don't leave the trail as this kills trailside vegetation and leads to trail widening and trail braiding.
- Try using south-facing trails as they will dry up much quicker and allow for faster accessibility.

We must try to resist the temptation to go around muddy sections of trail and create a new route around wet sections. Before you know it, they will be dry, and the summer riding, hiking, and equestrian use will be that much sweeter for all of us.

The academy will begin on Wednesday, March 18 and is a 10-week program designed to provide Jefferson County residents with hands-on experiences and information about how the Sheriff's Office functions. The class will be held each Wednesday evening from 6-9 p.m.

Participants will learn about the many aspects of law enforcement from veteran deputies who teach in their own areas of expertise. In a classroom setting — enhanced with tours — citizens will explore various aspects of law enforcement and acquire firsthand knowledge of patrol, criminal investigations, K-9, Bomb Squad, detention operations and more. Each class provides insight into the challenging tasks

deputy sheriffs and investigators must face

If you've ever been curious about law enforcement and how it really works, or perhaps have an interest in exploring the possibilities of a career in law enforcement, this academy is the place for you. Participation in any physical activities is strictly voluntary.

Participation in the academy requires a commitment of one night a week for 10 weeks. There is no fee for the academy and participants must be residents of Jefferson County and at least 18 years old. Space in the class is limited so don't delay. Once the academy is full, applicants will be placed on an eligibility list for 2016.

Common Health, Fitness and Weight Loss Myths

1. True or False: After the age of 30 your metabolism starts to decline.

True, but a trick question! Our metabolism goes down because we are less active and thus lose muscle mass. Muscles are the body's metabolic power house. The more muscle tissue you have, the more calories you burn at rest. Hence the importance of staying active and doing strength training!

- Fact: Eating meat, whole milk/dairy, sugar and white bread/pasta will cause you to develop more wrinkles.
 Eating more fruits, vegetables, oils and whole grains will help you to develop fewer wrinkles.
- 3. True or False: Walking the dog every day is enough exercise.

False! It's not enough exercise if you want to prevent chronic diseases like diabetes and heart disease or lose weight. Everyone should be getting at least 30

minutes of moderate to vigorous activity most days a week. For weight loss we need 60-90 minutes. Your heart rate should be up, and it should be hard to carry on a conversation during the activity. No time for exercise? See item No. 4.

4. True or False: The average American child uses 38.5 hours of media a week (TV, video games, etc.).

True! There is a direct correlation between our sedentary lifestyles and both the obesity epidemic (for children and adults) and the rise in chronic diseases like diabetes (yes, in children, too!). It is time to start moving!

MA Board Meeting

The following is a summary of items from the Jan. 20 business meeting of the Ken-Caryl Ranch Master Association Board:

- A motion tabled in December approving the site north of the Ranch House for the Veteran's Monument was withdrawn as the Committee has received approval for another site.

The Jefferson County Public Library's Bookmobile began service in the Ken-Caryl Ranch area in July 2014 and now provides weekly Saturday service from noon-4 p.m. in the Safeway parking lot at Ken Caryl Ave. and Shaffer Parkway.





Jury Duty Scam

Submitted by Jefferson County Sheriff's Office
The phone rings, you pick it up, and
the caller identifies himself as an official
from the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office
Warrants Unit. He says you failed to report
for jury duty and that a warrant is out for
your arrest. The scammer is quick to offer a
solution: a fine, payable by credit card, that
will clear up the problem. This is when you
should hang up the phone because it's a

Jury scams have been around for years, but have seen resurgence in the past few weeks in Jefferson County. As a rule, courts or the Sheriff's Office will never ask for confidential information over the phone. Instead, these offices generally correspond with prospective jurors via mail or email, providing written proof.

This scam's bold simplicity may be what makes it so effective. Facing the unexpected threat of arrest, victims are caught off guard and may be quick to part with some funds or information to defuse the situa-

tion. Protecting yourself is key: Never give out personal information when you receive an unsolicited phone call, and most certainly never wire or send money as a result of such call. The "jury" here at the Sheriff's Office has a unanimous verdict: when in doubt, hang up.





CodeRED Emergency **Notifications**

In Jefferson County, the CodeRED system (sometimes called "Reverse 911") allows the county to call citizens to warn them of danger. With it, the county can simultaneously call multiple phones within a designated area to warn residents of flood, fire, tornadoes, chemical spills or dangerous suspects. Within moments, calls reach the affected community to deliver warnings and critical safety instructions.

If you receive a CodeRED call, the voice on the line will let you know it's a message from the Sheriff's Office. Also, your caller ID should display our agency's name and a call-back number. The CodeRED system works with all phones that have a TDD line (for the hearing impaired). If you have a telephone zapper used to block out telemarketers, or if your phone is blocked to unknown callers, you will not receive CodeRED calls.

The CodeRED system calls numbers from two databases. One is the county's 911 database, with all listed and unlisted landlines. If you have a landline, it is automatically included in this database.

The second is a new database of mobile phone and VoIP numbers, established in 2009, whose owners have opted in to receive the calls. If you don't have a traditional landline phone, or would like to receive a cell phone call in addition to the call on your landline phone, consider registering for this free service. 

Reminder About Agreement for Use of Ridge Recreation Center

Residents of Ken-Caryl Ranch (KCR) can use the Foothills Ridge Recreation Center at Foothills resident rates for 2015.

The Ridge Recreation Center, which is located at 6613 South Ward St. just north of the boundary of KCR, is owned and operated by Foothills, a local park and recreation provider. Residents of KCR have always been able to use Foothills facilities as they are all open to the public. However, prior to 2014, residents of KCR were assessed non-resident fees for Foothills facilities as it is a separate park and recreation district. Residents of KCR do not pay property taxes to help support the facilities owned and managed by Foothills.

For calendar year 2014, KCRMD and Foothills entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) to permit KCR residents to use the drop-in amenities of the Ridge Recreation Center at the same daily rates as Foothills residents. The year 2014 was used as a trial period to gauge the use and popularity of the facility with residents of KCR with the KCRMD subsidizing the non-resident fee differential.

The IGA has proved to be quite popular with KCR residents with KCRMD subsidizing nearly \$8,000 in 2014 for non-resident

fee differentials for the benefit of KCR residents. Based on the positive feedback from KCR residents during 2014, the KCRMD and Foothills Boards of Directors have agreed to renew the IGA for 2015 with no changes.

The Ridge Recreation Center offers users an indoor lap and separate leisure activity pool, a therapy pool, a gymnasium and track, a cardio

weight room, racquetball courts and a rock climbing wall. As part of the agreement, KCR residents must pay \$5 for a special ID card issued by Foothills that will identify the user as a resident of KCR. ID cards that were issued to KCR residents in 2014 are still valid for 2015.

The current agreement is exclusive to the Ridge Recreation Center only. The agreement does not include a discount for use of the Edge Ice Arena, the Peak Community and Wellness Center, or any other Foothills amenities. The special rate is only for the drop-in use of these amenities and does not apply to classes or youth programs.
